Dear Wilson Families.

I hope that you and your loved ones are doing well.

Given the far reaching <u>economic impacts</u> of Coronavirus, school districts across the state are expecting significant budget reductions for next year (and beyond). PPS is taking proactive steps to offset the impact of these reductions. Starting this week, most PPS employees will be <u>partially furloughed</u>. This is expected to save dozens of positions for next year.

In most cases, the partial (20%) furlough will result in PPS staff working Monday-Thursday between now and July 31. This means that Wilson teachers,

counselors, admin, and other staff will not be available on Fridays. I want to apologize in advance for the disruption that this may cause you and your student. I know that establishing a weekly routine has been difficult during the school closure and this schedule change complicates things further. Unfortunately, this cost-saving decision was born of sheer necessity.

Q3 report cards should be arriving home shortly. Please review the grades with your student and reach out to your student's teachers if you have any questions. Our counselors and admin are also available to support if needed. My hope is that all of our students will successfully complete the work that is needed to earn second semester credit.

Finally, I want to wish a happy Mother's Day to all of you who celebrate. I hope that your weekend includes moments of peace, relaxation, and expressions of gratitude.

Reminder about the SafeOregon Tip Line

Keeping with our commitment to student safety, PPS joined school districts across the state a couple years ago in using the SafeOregon Tip Line. We want to remind you about this important resource.

SafeOregon was funded by the Oregon Legislature as part of a statewide effort to improve school safety. It provides a secure means for anyone to anonymously report suspicious or imminently unsafe situations that may occur either in person or online.

Examples of suspicious or imminently unsafe situations include: threats of violence/access to weapons, fights, substance use, bullying/harassment, discrimination, intimidation, suicidality, self-harm, bias/hate crimes, and hate speech that is intended to insult, offend, or intimidate based on the attributes of an individual or a group (including disability, gender, gender identity, race/ethnicity, religion, or sexual orientation).

Anyone, from students to parents to community members, can access the system in a variety of ways:

- A live call/text (844-472-3367)
- An email to tip@safeoregon.com
- The mobile app that can be downloaded from your Smart Phone via iTunes or Google Play

Trained staff are available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, to respond.

Verselandia is Virtualandia in 2020!

Since 2011, Literary Arts has produced the city-wide youth poetry slam Verselandia! This year, however, due to school closures and gathering bans, Verselandia! had to be reframed into a virtual event. Virtualandia is an



opportunity for Portland and east Multnomah County high school students to still take part in a city-wide poetry initiative.

Video lessons will be uploaded on the Virtualandia Google Site weekly. Students can start the process at any time, however, in order to receive feedback on a poem, students can submit a poem between May 11 and May 20. At that point, students will be able to revise their work with the feedback and the help from the final video on revision. Literary Arts encourages students to use the hashtag #virtualandia on their own social media accounts if they would like to share their work or document the process. Literary Arts will also publish a cohesive collection of student work online.

Spring Athletic Fees

Dear Wilson Families,

As you know, Gov. Kate Brown has canceled all in-person classes in the state for the rest of the 2019-20 school year due COVID 19. Following that announcement, the Oregon School Activities Association, which governs high school sports in the state, has canceled all spring sports and championships.

Here in Portland Public Schools, those decisions mean that spring sports are canceled for the Portland Interscholastic League at the high school levels. We know this is difficult news for student-athletes who have been hard at work preparing for the spring season, especially for the seniors. Please know that you are not alone, that your disappointment is one of the sacrifices that all of us are making during this historic crisis. For spring athletes, your coaches will stay in touch with you throughout the season. Our coaches will continue to follow the guidelines set by the OSAA which are updated at the <u>organization's coronavirus webpage</u>.

Wilson families who have paid the PIL Spring Sports Fee have the following options:

- 1. Request a refund-The funds will be returned to you using the same method of payment you used originally. Please note, electronic refunds (if you paid with a credit or debit card) will be issued first. It will take additional time process refunds for families that paid with a check or cash. We will issue and mail a check back to these families. We are still navigating how to physically get refund checks processed, signed and mailed during this time.
- 2. Donate the fee to help defray the cost of equipment that we have already procured for spring and help to pay the stipends for our coaches.



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If you would like to donate your fee, please reach out to Ana Curtis at acurtis@pps.net by April 23rd. If you paid by credit card, you should receive your refund soon. If you paid by check or cash, we will have to print a check and mail it which could take 1-2 weeks.

We hope that all of you are safe and sound during these unprecedented times.

- 5. Many colleges across the nation are committed to helping the class of 2021 by going test optional for next year and understanding that grades and transcripts across the nation will look different. They will evaluate students based on the greater context of COVID 19 as well as our local context.

They are all scheduled to visit Wilson High School this fall, along with 47 other colleges and universities so far. Log in to your Naviance account to check the current list of colleges and get signed up.



Why are college visits important?

- A good way to begin thinking about what you want out of a college experience is by attending a visit and
 listening to presentations. They can help you figure out what you don't know about what might be important
 to you!
- Juniors and seniors can help narrow down or expand their interests in colleges
- The college reps that make the visits are often the reader of your application when you apply, so if you
 intend to apply to a school that is visiting us, it is worth your while to meet them face to face and show
 interest in their school

Keep in mind that most college visits happen during class time and you are responsible for what you miss, so choose responsibly and wisely
