Parent-Teacher Conferences at Wilson, November 25 and 26

Parent & student – teacher conferences take place Monday and Tuesday, November 25th and 26th. Students are encouraged to attend conferences, if possible.

In an effort to meet the needs of everyone, we offer three types of conferences: Individual, Arena, and Group Conferences. Please know that you may contact our teachers at any time throughout the year and are not limited to these conference times.

- **Individual Conferences** are ten minutes long and take place in the privacy of each individual teacher's classroom. Signups for individual conferences are now closed.
- **Arena Conferences** are five minutes long and take place on Monday, Nov. 25th from 6-8:15p.m. and Tuesday, Nov. 26th from 8:15-11:15 a.m. Most of our teachers will be present in the gym and cafeteria. For students who are progressing well in their classes, the arena is a great venue for quick check-ins with teachers. If you have issues to discuss with your child's teachers that are more involved or require privacy, please reach out for a separate time to speak to them. Counselors are a great resource to include in the conversation. We will have Chromebooks available in the hallway to sign up for ParentVue and email lists.



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- **Group Conferences** are scheduled for specific students with whom we need to meet as a team. Wilson staff members identify students for Group Conferences and have contacted parents to schedule them.
