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Dear Sabin Families.

Thank you for your support and partnership over these first three months of school. During the month of November, we will have seven nonschool days and in December, we will have 10 days in which there is no school for students. As you can imagine, it can present some challenges for students and staff. During non-school days, I encourage you to limit TV time while encouraging and model continual learning. Set a goal of reading and completing a book during the holiday season. Find out about web-based reading and math supports like Moby Max and make sure you have password access – you can talk with your child's teacher more about this.

As you may know, this month's learner profile attribute is caring. We recognized students during assemblies who demonstrated this characteristic in their peer and adult interactions. Remember, the social emotional development of children is as critical as their academic growth is for their career and life success. Social-emotional development involves a child's experience, expression, and management of emotions and their ability to establish positive and rewarding relationships.

At Sabin, we are committed to the socialemotional development of students in

partnership with families. We do not support behavior that is counter to positive social-emotional development including teasing, name-calling, putdowns, or any other form of behavior often



described as bullying. I encourage you to continue to talk with your child about how they can respond when they encounter this type of behavior. Please let them know to involve an adult staff member if they are unable to resolve the matter independently. Thank you for all you do in support of ALL students!

You may be aware that the PPS School board voted to open Harriet Tubman Middle School next year. In order for Tubman to open in the fall of 2018, there are many things that must happen. Our planning principal, Natasha Butler, has made wonderful connections with students, staff and families. It is important that the Sabin community offer ideas and input toward a vision for Tubman middle school.


