CLASS ASSIGNMENTS

Students and families are eager to learn who their teachers will be. This year we will return to a traditional self contained classroom model. Every student will have one classroom teacher. They may receive support and services from other teachers throughout the day for services such as English Language Development, Special Education or intervention support. There are two ways to find out who your student's teacher will be.

- The first is to log into <u>Parentvue</u> and click on class schedule. If you do not have access to Parentvue, please call the office for your activation letter.
- The office will also send classroom assignments out through Remind prior to the first day for those unable to access Parentvue.

ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

Arrival 7:45-8:00

• Each morning, kindergarten and first graders will go directly to the cafeteria for breakfast and sit at their assigned tables

- Second and third grade will line up under the large undercover area near 66th ave
- Fourth and fifth graders will line up in the gym

New this year! All students will be asked to enter from the back of the building. Our front door, at the top of the ramp, will remain locked. Students who arrive after 8:10 are marked tardy and must enter through the front door and check in at the front office to receive a tardy slip before heading to class.

Dismissal 2:30

- Kinder and first grade students will be dismissed from their teachers under the small undercover area and the black top.
- Second and third graders will be dismissed under the large undercover area.
- Fourth and fifth grade students are dismissed on the blacktop, closer to the annex building.

Students who are not picked up by 2:37pm will be taken to the office and will need to be signed out there. Adults are not allowed on campus prior to 2:30 without checking in at the office. We ask that if you arrive early for dismissal, that you kindly wait on the nearest sidewalk. This helps us to keep our campus secure and our students and staff safe.

CELL PHONE AND PERSONAL DEVICES AT SCHOOL



Scott School Cell Phone Policy

We recognize that cell phones can be used for various purposes such as communication, education, entertainment, and safety. However, we also believe that cell phone use in the classroom can be a source of distraction, disruption, and disrespect; and cell phones can sometimes interfere with our students' learning process and our school climate. Therefore, we have established the following cell phone policy.

 Students are not allowed to use cell phones during the school day, including in the hallways, cafeteria, recess or restrooms.

2. During class time, cell phones must be powered off and stored in backpacks or stored by the classroom teacher.

3. We ask that guardians call the school office at (5O3) 916-6369 if there is an emergency and they need to reach their child. The office staff will relay the message to the student or the teacher as soon as possible.

If a student violates the cell phone policy:

1. A first violation will result in a reminder and their cell phone being held by the teacher until after school.

 A second violation will result in the cell phone being held by the teacher and gaurdians will be notified.

3. A third violation will result in the cell phone being held in the office until the parent or guardian comes to pick it up.

We appreciate your cooperation and support in enforcing this cell phone policy. We believe that this policy will help us create a positive and productive learning environment for all our students and staff.

Reconocemos que los teléfonos móviles se pueden utilizar para diversos fines, como comunicación, educación, entretenimiento y seguridad. Sin embargo, también creemos que el uso del teléfono celular en el aula puede ser una fuente de distracción, interrupción y falta de respeto; y los teléfonos celulares a veces pueden interferir con el proceso de aprendizaje de nuestros estudiantes y nuestro clima escolar. Por lo tanto, hemos establecido la siguiente política de teléfono celular.

 No se permite a los estudiantes usar teléfonos celulares durante el día escolar, incluso en los pasillos, cafetería, recreo o baños.

- Durante el tiempo de clase, los teléfonos celulares deben estar apagados y guardados en mochilas o guardados por el maestro del salón de clases.
- 3. Solicitamos que los tutores llamen a la oficina de la escuela al (5O3) 916-6369 si hay una emergencia y necesitan comunicarse con su hijo. El personal de la oficina transmitirá el mensaje al estudiante o al maestro lo antes posible.

Si un estudiante viola la política de telefonía celular:

 Una primera infracción resultará en un recordatorio y el maestro retendrá su teléfono celular hasta después de clases.

2. Una segunda infracción resultará en que el maestro retenga el teléfono celular y se notificará a los guardianes.

 Una tercera infracción resultará en que el teléfono celular se retenga en la oficina hasta que el padre o tutor venga a recogerlo.

Apreciamos su cooperación y apoyo para hacer cumplir esta política de teléfono celular. Creemos que esta política nos ayudará a crear un ambiente de aprendizaje positivo y productivo para todos nuestros estudiantes y personal.


