Portland Public Schools Free Meal Program For All

Meal access continues for ALL Vernon students, whether or not they return to school for hybrid in-person instruction or if they remain in distance learning. All school meals are free and no student ID or names are needed to receive meals. Meals will be available for pick up at Vernon from 2:30-3:00 in the little garden on the 22nd Ave side of the school near the cafeteria entrance.

If your student is staying in distance learning and you wish to pick up at Vernon, please call the school at 503-916-6415 so we can add you to the list and be sure to have meals ready for you. This also helps us to reduce food waste.

The other option is to visit any of the meal sites below between 3:30 and 4:30 p.m. on school days to pick up meals.

Tools to Practice for Return to In-Person Learning

You maybe starting in-person learning in the next couple of weeks or next fall. Whenever you return to in-person school, preparation and practice will help it go better. Here are some tools.

- 1. **Imagine** what it will be like so that you are prepared: <u>Visualizing our Return to In-person Learning</u> guided by Ms. Hanna
- 2. **Self-Focus** & go inward: Recognize what is in your Control and what is not while at school. Practice going inward and focusing on your breath when you notice discomfort. Inward is a place where you always have some choice. <u>Be a Ninja</u>



3. **Reset** for Regulation: Remember, we are out of practice being together at school and this can make us feel tired or more easily upset. So practice these tricks to find regulation when you notice discomfort.

Celebrating Beverly Cleary

I Beloved Oregon author and former Portland resident, Beverly Cleary died on March 25, 2021 at the age of 104. She was one of America's most successful writers, writing 38 fiction books for children and young adults, with over 85 million copies translated into 29 languages.

Starting in 1950 with her first book, Henry Huggins, and its series of books, followed by Ramona Quimby and the Ramona series, she also wrote The Mouse and the Motorcycle, which was made into a movie.

Born in McMinnville in 1926, her family moved from a farm in Yamhill to northeast Portland where Clearv attended grade School and high school. She attended Fernwood Grade School (now Beverly Cleary MS - Fernwood Campus) and wrote about many familiar places in NE Portland (look up Klickitat and Siskiyou Streets!).



Every year, the American Library Association celebrates Cleary's birthday on April 12 with D.E.A.R., which stands for "Drop Everything And Read." This is a national celebration of reading, and families are encouraged to devote 30 minutes to enjoying books together.





MYP Library Assignments


