RIGHT BRAIN AT VERNON

The <u>Right Brain Initiative</u> is a partnership of schools, local government, private donors and the cultural community. Together, they're working to make arts education accessible to every K-8 student in the Portland, tri-county region.


The future is going to be a whole new ballgame. Whether it's cleaning up our oceans or working on self-driving cars, one thing we know is the world is going to be way different than it is today. That means people are going to need every ounce of their brains to figure it out. Every bit of our imaginations, innovations and abilities will be needed to see things in new ways, or invent things we have yet to understand. The Right Brain Initiative is here to help change the way kids learn in the Portland metro area by bringing discovery, collaboration and creativity into the classroom. Creative thinking is the secret sauce when supporting kids' abilities to problem solve, innovate and think critically. By introducing new ways to learn, kids will become more engaged students.

This year, nearly 29,000 students in 70 Portland metro schools, in eight school districts are expressing, exploring, imagining, creating and using the full measure of their minds. We're a program of the Regional Arts & Culture Council, but we engage the entire community, working arm-in-arm to create long-term, lasting change within our school systems.

At Vernon students are engaging with three separate artists. Currently, the 6th and 7th graders are working with David Loitz on a stop motion animation project connected to their science unit on cells and the human body. The 1st and 2nd graders are working with Albert Alter, a theater artist on using mime skills to act out stories and using expression to show how animals move in their habitats and surroundings. Kindergarten will be working with Albert in February and 8th grade will be working with David. The 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students will be working with theater artist, Rick Huddle, in February.
