






FUN FOR THE OWLS T-SHIRT COMPETITION!


Vernon Library Updates

Welcome Back to Library!

Welcome back to library for the 2021-2022 school year! Our library space is equipped with physical distancing markers, air filtration, and other strategies to keep students safe, and I'm so excited to welcome



students back to an in-person library experience this year.

Students in grades K-6 will have once weekly sessions in the library for book, research, and information literacy instruction. We'll also have the opportunity to check out books each week from our substantial and diverse collection of titles to interest everyone. Students in grades 7-8 will also have designated times to visit the library and check out library materials this year.

Kindergarten and first grade continue to receive instruction on the sections of the library and book care through the month of September and will begin checking out books in October. A maximum of three books may be checked out at one time.



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SUN CLASSES FAIL 2021

Grades (3rd - 5th)

OBOB

OBOB is a reading program where students form a team of four to five students and read as a team the sixteen books from the OBOB list. Student teams are asked a variety of questions related to the content of the books they are reading. Student teams compete at Vernon and one team will advance in the Spring to the Regional OBOB competition where they will compete virtually against other schools.

Chess for Success provides chess clubs in high-poverty schools. A coach is hired and is given our trademarked curriculum and supplies. Students receive two hours per week of chess instruction and practice from October to March. The club participants get to play in Chess for Success tournaments for free. The students design and are given a club t-shirt, and a chess board and set to keep. In addition, Chess for Success gives a few chess books to the school library.
