UPCOMING AFFINITY GROUP MEETINGS: When we attend a monthly affinity group meeting, we get to know one another, share resources, and most importantly, help to build an inclusive, supportive community for ALL of our children!

Caregivers of Neurodiverse Student Group - Tuesday, November 5 (6:00 – 8:00pm, MPR)

Does your child struggle with inattention, reading, or other learning challenges, behavior issues at home or school? Does your child have a hard time with unstructured time at school (e.g. recess, lunch)? The **Caregivers of Neurodiverse Student Group** (CNDSG) is a new group that provides a safe, judgement-free space to discuss how we as parents, caregivers, teachers and our community can better support our children. The CNDSG is about sharing stories, discussing challenges and resources about our children experiencing trauma, anxiety, autism, ADD, ADHD, learning disabilities, sensory issues, dyslexia, etc. Our first meeting was held on October 15th; our November meeting date will be **Tuesday, November 5**!! We serve family dinner and provide an excellent childcare program for our children during our meeting time. We encourage parents and caregivers to join if they are experiencing any of the following:

Your child is distracted or dysregulated and having challenges at home/school Your child is on an IEP or 504 plan (or you are not sure if your child needs one)

Your child struggles to make/keep friends

You are a parent/caregiver that needs support and looking for how to access resources

Families of Black Students - Monday, November 4 (5:45-7:00pm) This is a wonderful time for parents to come together, share resources, and/ or bring up issues or concerns regarding our children. Our November meeting will be a special fun time for our group as we will be having "Thankful for Fellowship" November featuring a family game night. Bring your favorite games, get schooled on some new ones and come out and join the fun! Family dinner will be provided.

Las Familias - Monday, November 4 (5:45-7:00pm, RM 107): Do you want to be empowered as a caretaker to advocate for your children's success? We are looking forward to you and your family joining us for a wonderful time of fellowship, and discussion of the issues that impact the children of our community. Our meetings are both in English and Spanish!

LGBTQ+ - Monday, November 6 (5:30 – 7:00pm, RM): LGBTQ Families of Vernon will be meeting on Weds, Nov 6 from 5:30 to 6:30 in Room 117. We'll be talking about what's happening at Vernon to address homophobia, especially in light of the recent homophobic graffiti incident. We will have snacks and childcare.

OP Ed – "Brilliant Strokes of Light"

I appreciate the conversation and courage it took to engage in discourse about our children at recess on our Vernon Facebook Community Page. I know these can be difficult conversations; however, some of the rhetoric and "knee jerk" responses I read were a bit disheartening. The use of some of the emotionally charged language such as "culprits," "unsafe" and "violence" are loaded terms to describe little people... let us all please remember these are our children.

I ask that we all pause and remember, that all children don't come from the same households, experience the same privilege, same emotional, mental, physical, spiritual wellness, or show up to school with a suitcase of conflict management skills/ tools. We don't know what students go home to, arrive at school from, what experiences they have, what physical or what emotional challenges they face. They may not know themselves what to do about it or how to effectively express trauma/stress, different level of abilities, or exposure to inconsistent rules/ environments. This is not just happening at Vernon School, but occurs at all schools because we are all humans.

Many of us as parents and caregivers have been intentional in exposing our children to diversity and difference in our community as the world they face is much more diverse than many of ours were for us growing up, as many of us hail from more traditionally segregated communities. Part of the uncomfortableness diversity can create is conflict. Our children must LEARN to play and be together, learn to honor each other's differences, world perceptions, and methods for dealing with conflict. Because these little beings are in our hearts, it can be a super uncomfortable process for us. But we must avoid shrinking back into our old but comfortable ideologies that support self-interest first/community second, or ideologies that kept us divided to seek blame and discipline, rather than understanding and justice. Our students will make a better world together than what we had in our past, if we continue to support them and give them resources to work and relate in a diverse world.

We as parents and caregivers also have the responsibility to teach our kids how to be assertive in responding to aggressive behaviors, how to get help or signal to playground/classroom monitors that a student needs additional attention, support or is engaging in unsafe behavior. There will be conflict regardless of where our children go and the more diversity we experience, the more differences, the more opportunities that we will not have the same views, tools, ways of relating to the world. Learning to be self-aware, to be assertive without being aggressive when responding to conflict, is a big part of education and self-discovery that happens slowly over time. We must be intentional in how we help our children build diverse communities to allow space for different learning styles and different learning journeys. We also need to ensure we are consistent and equitable in how we design and implement justice once conflict has escalated.

Lastly, our job as volunteers at recess is to support the journey for all students, and that we are educated to understand our school's justice policy regarding incidents. We can help all children when we volunteer by having a mindset that we are promoting a safe educational space for every child, not just looking out for our own. Before we run to the playground to protect "our" kids and make sure they are safe, let's make sure that we do our own self-check, allow ourselves to "re-center before we react." Make sure we are putting aside our personal biases, trigger words/ past experiences, media overexposure, -isms, and once we have completed the background check process, freely run to the playground to help create a fun learning free space to support every child. Of course, it includes reporting unsafe behavior to the administrators, and engaging in structured play, free play, and sometimes removing ourselves from their play. This is when we get to stand back and watch our brilliant strokes of light create their own dance together, rearranging the universe before our eyes... even if there are a few missteps along the way.
