Vernon Auction: What it's all about, how it works, what to expect

- 1) The main purpose of the auction is to raise money to support our teachers and give our kids the best possible education Vernon can offer. It's our biggest fundraiser of the year. We hope to raise \$85,000!
- 2) It's a good idea to set your budget beforehand, so you know how much you want to spend.
- 3) There are several ways to participate without spending a lot of money. \$10 to \$20 will get you into the game of Heads or Tails, Sign-up Parties, and the gift certificate wall.
- 4) A \$100 "Golden Ticket" is a raffle for the winner's choice of anything in the Live Auction.
- 5) During the live auction, there will be a "Special Appeal for Vernon." The auctioneer will invite everyone to raise their bid cards to make a donation. There are no goods exchanged, it is purely a donation.
- 6) Be sure to check in at the beginning of the night to get your bid card! You will need it to sign up for parties, bid on items, and participate in the Special Appeal.
- 7) The PTA supports Vernon through fundraising and volunteering. The Run for the Owls and the Auction fund approximately 27 different areas including our music program (teacher, supplies, and musical performances), art supplies, library books, teacher grants, computers for kids, field trips, SUN School support, and garden coordinator, and STEAM events.

The rough numbers are:

\$30,000 for the arts programs, supplies and field trips

\$17,000 for STEAM, community events, family school nights and SUN School support \$26,000 for teacher grants, library books, the garden and technology
