
This is a great opportunity to get students prepared for summer reading. All of the funds raised from the Book Fair will go towards new books for the Library as well as new books for classroom libraries.





Parent Input for Class Placement: 2017-2018

During the last month of school, we begin the process of forming class groups for the coming school year. Information from homeroom and support teachers about each student's progress, skill levels, special needs, social and emotional characteristics, and learning styles is considered in determining appropriate placement.

This form gives you, as parent/guardian, an opportunity to express your thoughts and to contribute to the process of class placement. We ask that you do not request a particular teacher, but instead let us know what type of classroom environment would suit your child's needs best.

Parents/guardians may complete our class placement form and return it to school by the end of the day, Friday, June 2. Our classroom, specials, and support teachers all work together to help make the best placement we can. Mr. Keefer and Mr. Parker make the final decisions for class placements.
