What is Site Council?

Site Council is a group of administrators, teachers, and parents that identify ways to support the school community.

By providing leadership, direction and support, we define school priorities and implement ways to improve them.

At its core, Site Council is about tailoring the Vernon experience to the specific needs of our students and our community.

So you do what now?

We review data, trends, and the things we hear from our community to ensure we design and implement programs that best serve the needs of our students and community.

We're actually mandated by the state to:

- a. Develop plans to improve the professional growth of the school's staff;
- b. Improve the school's instructional program;
- c. Develop and coordinate plans for the implementation of programs under this chapter at the school; and
- d. Administer grants-in-aid for the professional development of teachers and classified District employees.

That means we have a say in choosing the methods and programs we use to teach the students. We're able to determine the types of programs we offer the school community. And, we're able to direct the ways and manner of our staff's professional development.

This year, our Site Council worked on equity in our school with our series of Community Movie Nights centered around race, community, communication, understanding, and action.

If you have ideas about issues you'd like the school to address, the Site Council is the place to voice your opinion. If you'd like input on programs and curriculum at Vernon, come to Site Council meetings and have your voice heard. If you'd like a say in the kinds of professional development opportunities you'd like our teachers to have, express it at Site Council.

Here are some things to know about for summer reading:

- 1) Multnomah County Library Every year the public library does a fun reading program where students track the amount of reading they complete over the summer and return it to any Multnomah Public Library for a prize. The reading game boards were passed out to students this week. For every 30 minutes of reading, students fill in a square. When they reach a prize level, they take it to the public library to receive a prize.
- 2) <u>Summer Reading lists</u> Please check out our library website which can be found through the Vernon website, selecting the library tab. Under the program tab, please select "summer reading 2017." This is where I will be posting summer reading lists. Currently there are book recommendations by classroom teachers and a variety of reading lists from the Multnomah County Library.
