Advisory

Students will be reviewing the schedule in Advisory on Friday the 11th. The district-wide schedule takes into account state mandates and utilizes a variety of learning experiences to engage students in the content; from whole class synchronous lessons, time for students to work offline in the afternoon, small group synchronous sessions, asynchronous assignments and office hours. All of these courses and expectations will be communicated through Canvas.

We know these are a lot of knew terms. So what do they mean:

<u>Synchronous lesson</u> – live classroom instruction that is occurring with the whole group through google meets or zoom.

<u>Applied Learning</u> – the independent work time students will use to complete assignments from the morning sessions, or previous days. We divided it up into three sessions here to help students organize their time amongst their classes and classwork.

(SG/OH/AS) – Small Groups/Office Hours/Asynchronous Learning - These sessions are designed to allow teachers to use formative assessment data to provide small group instruction to help students understand concepts, provide extension or answer question

Attendance

Middle School teachers are required to take attendance for every period taught. Unlike in person instruction that attendance can take a number of different formats. The attendance protocol, outlined by ODE on 8.11.20, states

that the following are evidence of attendance will be measured in at least one of the following ways within a 24 hour period:

- A. Participating in a video class
- B. Communication from the student to the teacher via chat, text message, communication app, or email
- C. A phone call between the teacher or EA/Paraprofessional with the student, or, for younger students, with the parent
- D. Posting completed coursework to a learning management system or web-based platform or via email.
- E. Turning in complete coursework on a given day.

Band Instruments
