# Picture Day:

October 28th will be our next opportunity for scholars and staff to take a school picture, as we know that yesterday's picture date was not an option for all of our families observing Yom Kippur. We recognize and honor that many of our scholars observe Yom Kippur and our sincerest apologies for the prior scheduling of yesterday's event. For families who observe, we hope your family had a meaningful Yom Kippur and look forward to taking a picture for your scholar on October 28th.

# Safety Updates:

We continue to practice the safety measures recommended through both our state and district operating procedures <u>here</u>. PPS is also sending out a survey to families. Please check your email. Details about the survey can be found <u>here</u>. PPS also has various vaccination clinics available for families, so we are sharing the flyers in both <u>English</u> and <u>Spanish</u>. We continue to spend our days reminding and reteaching scholars about safe school habits, and we will be reinforcing those habits again in the time for Advisory next Wednesday. PPS has added a dashboard to the district website <u>here</u>. Key reminders are here, again, so that we continue to work together to keep our community safe:

- Masks are mandatory indoors and outdoors for all school staff, essential visitors and all scholars.
- For the first six weeks, please plan on your scholar eating lunch outdoors in our field area. Eating indoors will only occur if weather conditions prevent outdoor eating. We have a plan for seating in cohorts and tracking attendance by seating, if and when we need to move indoors due to inclement weather.
- Only essential visitors may come into our buildings, and they must be masked. If you are driving your scholar to campus, please plan on wishing them a successful day from the parking lot, as we won't be able to have families walking scholars to classrooms at this time.
- Continue to self-screen your scholar prior to sending them to campus. If there are concerns about illness, your scholar should stay home. Not sure what to look for? <u>Here is a tool to</u> <u>reference</u>. Teachers will maintain Canvas classes (virtual information) if an absence occurs to help with sharing information. Email teachers directly, if your scholar may need to miss several days of class for any reason so that they can develop a plan for homework with your family.
- 3 feet of physical distance will be maintained, to the extent possible, during the school day. Our teachers have configured their classrooms to organize learning to meet the spacing guidelines.
- We continue to maintain a "symptom space" in our school in the event that anyone is displaying signs of illness, and we will follow district guidelines with families should there be a reported case of COVID, which includes a process for screening symptomatic scholars and possibly sending them home.
- All PPS employees have been required to submit their proof of COVID vaccination prior to the start of school. Any PPS employee without proof of vaccination by the state deadline will have additional action occur with human resources, which was articulated again in the PPS Board Meeting on Tuesday.

# Transportation:

As many families know, there is a nationwide shortage for bus drivers. That has led to various routes being combined, certain buses needing to take two trips each morning and afternoon, and various other struggles, including daily cancellations of routes, which we hear about at the same time that families are informed. We apologize for the on-going transportation issues! Each morning we inform our educators of the various late buses, and scholars will not be penalized for being late due to these issues. Please continue to send your concerns directly to the transportation department. While we wish we could help, our office team cannot fix any of these delays or shortages in driver staffing. <u>Here</u> is the direct link to contact the PPS transportation team.

## Cafeteria:

Scholars are welcome to bring their own sack lunch and are encouraged to bring a reusable water bottle daily to refill throughout the school day in our water fountains. We have three separate lunch times, by grade level (see bell schedule <u>here</u>). If scholars bring their own lunches, please be sure there is not a need to heat up the items. Scholars will be eating in our outdoor spaces during lunches to maintain the 3 feet of distrancing, to the extent possible. If the weather is poor, we will move to indoor eating alternatives with assigned seating to cohort scholars. <u>All scholars eat for free throughout the 21-22 year in PPS, which includes a breakfast offering and a lunch offering.</u>

## Lockers:

All scholars have been assigned a locker that is shared. To avoid overcrowding in our hallways, the more items scholars can store in the lockers, the better. Taking a smaller tote bag, like the one just given out to all scholars, to classes rather than a large full backpack, reduces hallway crowding. Most scholars are now able to access their lockers on the first try and are finding their way to their classes! Our campus map is <u>here</u>, if you would like to continue to review it with your scholar.

## Laptops:

Our WSMS scholars are scheduled to receive new laptops on October 13th through the <u>PPS</u> <u>1-2-1</u>. If your scholar was not issued a PPS device previously, using one from home will work until that date. We also have computers scholars can access while on campus, should they not

have access at home. We will continue to tell our educators to ensure that classroom activities can be completed without a PPS device until we receive our laptops on October 13th.

## School Clubs and Scholar Activities:

• We surveyed scholar club interests on Wednesday, and many clubs are starting and getting started. Clubs can meet during lunch, before school and after school, depending on the club advisor and scholars' schedules. Additionally, we will hold a Club Lunch to help our scholars find out more about various clubs that they can join and lead. Any scholar may start a club by getting a couple other scholars together and an educator to host a time and space.
