Oregon Battle of the Books 3rd, 4th and 5th Graders

Oregon Battle of the Books, OBOB, is a statewide voluntary reading motivation and comprehension program sponsored by the Oregon Association of School Libraries. Students in 3rd-12th grade, regardless of ability, are exposed to quality literature representing a variety of literary styles and viewpoints. The mission is to encourage and recognize students who enjoy reading, broaden reading interests, increase reading comprehension, promote academic excellence, and promote cooperative learning and teamwork among students.

- All 3rd-5th grade students who want to participate need to form a team of 4-5 players and a team coach (a parent or guardian). (see attached team building guidelines and pledge).
- Complete the attached Registration Form. Both the student and parent/guardian must sign the form.
- The teams will read the 16 books from the 2022-23 OBOB list. The students participating are
 encouraged to read at least 8 of the 16 books or 4 books each. Titles and author names as stated on
 this list should be memorized.
- Each team needs to choose a team name and designate a "Spokesperson". The Spokesperson's job is to provide the team's answers during the battles, speak for the team if any questions arise, and verify the scores at the end of each battle. Teams can alternate spokespersons for different battles.
- Teams will be matched against each other and answer specific questions about the books. The
 tournament will begin in mid-January, with battles being held daily during lunch recess. Prior to
 this, we will have optional practice battles (also during lunch recess).
- The team that wins the Stephenson competition will move on to compete against other schools in our region. The location of the OBOB Gr 3-5 Region 4 NorthWest competition is to be determined.

- This program is designed to encourage kids to read and discuss books with their friends and classmates. All teams will demonstrate character and good sportsmanship. Those players or teams who do not uphold these ideals will be disqualified from the tournament.

Team Building for Battle of the Books

Students interested in participating in Battle of the Books (OBOB) will need to form teams. As always at Stephenson, they are expected to be safe, responsible, and respectful as they go about this. Team building is an opportunity for students to build positive social skills, and a little coaching can go a long way. Parents/Guardians: please take the time to review the procedures and expectations below with your child. By signing the OBOB registration form, both student and parent/guardian are pledging to follow these team-building guidelines.

How do I get on a team? You find other Stephenson students in 3rd-5th grade that are interested in participating and sign up as a team.

- If you want to participate but aren't sure who you can be on a team with, tell your parents or our librarian, and they will help you.
- Teams will start registering during Library time during the month of November. If you decide you want to participate after that, you still can! Just ask your parents or Mr. Rocha if you need help finding a team.
- Sign up in the library.

How many members should our team have? At least 4 and no more than 5

- If your team is full and a classmate asks to join, you need to tell them no. Be respectful by explaining that your team is full and helping them find a team. That can be as simple as reminding them that they can ask for help.
- If your team has less than 4 members, you can ask your parents or Mr. Rocha for help finding more team members.
- If someone asks to join your team and you aren't sure if your team is full, be responsible by finding out and getting back to them.

If I was on a team last year, but want to be on a different team this year, can I change? Yes, many students change teams from one year to the next.

- If you decide to change, your teammates from last year might ask if you are coming back. Be respectful by saying no and explaining that you want the experience of working with a new group. You can let them know that a lot of kids change teams, and they should easily be able to find a new teammate. You can remind them that if they have a hard time finding someone, they can ask a parent or Mr. Rocha to help.
- Being respectful means staying focused on the positive reasons you are changing teams. It's not respectful to say unkind things about others as you change teams or as you talk with your friends about forming teams.

Please remember OBOB is designed to be fun and encourage a love for reading! Working together we can make it a positive and rewarding experience for all students.
