Getting Home...

On the SUN registration form, there are two options available: Pick-up by parent/guardian **OR** student's discretion (activity bus, walk, bike, Tri-Met).

The activity bus will begin running on the first day of programming. If you have selected student's discretion, your student is eligible to take the activity bus home. Misbehavior may lead to the loss of bus privileges.
