
# 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Families Only - BABY ADS!

#### **RESOURCES FOR FAMILIES**



The flu is spread mainly by droplets when people cough, sneeze or talk. It also can spread when you touch surfaces or objects that have flu germs on them and then touch your nose or mouth. Cough etiquette and hand washing are important ways to prevent the spread of the flu.

The CDC recommends everyone 6 months and older get the vaccine. It takes about 2 weeks for antibodies to develop after vaccination.

También puede propagarse cuando toca superficies u objetos que tienen gérmenes de gripe y luego se toca la nariz o la boca. La etiqueta para la tos y el lavado de manos son formas importantes de prevenir la propagación de la gripe.

Los CDC recomiendan que todas las personas de 6 meses en adelante se vacunen. Los anticuerpos tardan aproximadamente 2 semanas en desarrollarse después de la vacunación.
