

Idling Gets You Nowhere

Vehicle idling means running the engine when you're not going anywhere. Unnecessary vehicle idling is bad for our air, wallets, car, and especially our kids. School pick-up and drop-off times are key opportunities to reduce the amount of idling that happens near children, who are the most susceptible to idling's health hazards.



What Can You Do?

- * Turn your vehicle off after 10 seconds If you are waiting for your student for more than 10 seconds, turn off your engine.
- * Park and Walk Help reduce idling and get some exercise by parking a few blocks from school and walking to drop-off or pick-up your child.
- * Spread the word Talk to your family, friends, and neighbors about the health and environmental benefits of reducing idling. Beaumont Bobcats want to be idle free!
