### **Our Kids Are Counting on Us - Vote!**




# The Safe Routes to School travel survey is now open!

until **November 8<sup>th</sup>**. There are currently NO responses from Beaumont.

This fall there are some changes - the survey is online only now. **Why?** It will save the Safe Routes to School team a lot of time, paper and money.

The travel survey helps the Portland Bureau of Transportation (PBOT) improve its Safe Routes to School program and helps prioritize safety projects when funding is available. Additionally, the data collected through this survey is key for Safe Routes to School to secure grant funding for safety programming and infrastructure throughout the city.

### Be Safe. Be Seen.

» Be visible by carrying a flashlight or flashing pedestrian safety strobe, apply reflective stickers to your rain coat and backpack, and/or sew-on retro-reflective tape on your jacket and coat.

» Be alert by taking out your ear buds and putting away your phone or other distractions while you cross.

» Cross busy streets at a signal or marked mid-block crossing - drivers anticipate pedestrians at these locations more than unmarked crossings.

» Look in all directions before crossing the street and cross after all the cars have stopped or passed.

» Make eye contact with drivers before you cross to help communicate that drivers see you.

»Stop and look to make sure cars have stopped for you before crossing the next lane of traffic
