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Bicycle Safety Course Is Arriving Soon!

The Bicycle Safety Program is scheduled to begin May 1, 2018 for all 6 th grade students in Ms. Smith's Health/PE class. This comprehensive program engages students by teaching traffic safety through classroom activities and on-the- bike practice. Students will develop essential skills that teach how to adjust helmets for proper fit, use of hand signals, street signs interpretation and how to maneuver safely through intersections and out of driveways. The goal is to empower students and keep them safe while traveling in their neighborhood and surrounding streets.

A permission slip will be sent home mid April which requires a parent or legal guardian signature for participation; All signed permission slips should be returned to Ms. Smith A.S.A.P. Participants who intend to use their own bicycle or helmet must agree to have them inspected by me, Ms. Smith, **before** the program begins. I am available between April 10-27, 2018 from 8:00-9:00 a.m. and 3:45-4:00 p.m. for inspections except Tuesday afternoons. If

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personal equipment is determined to be unsafe, then participants will be required to use equipment provided by the program or get the needed repairs done prior to beginning the program. Note: All personal bikes require a bike lock in order to secure them to bike racks during school hours. **Please do not leave bikes overnight!**

such as threats of violence, fights, drugs and alcohol, weapons, bullying, harassment, intimidation or self-harm.

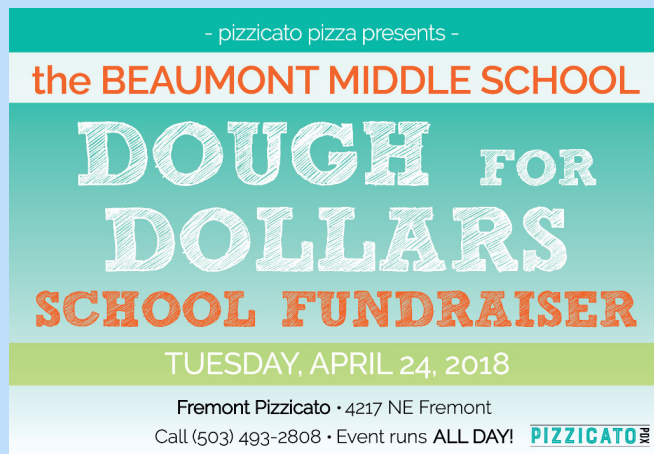
Anyone, from students to parents to community members, can access the system in a variety of ways, including:
