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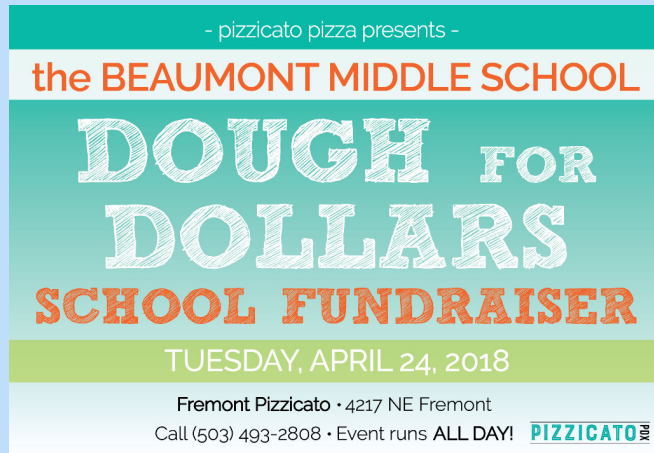
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daily, getting to know students and teachers. He will be on campus as long as he is not called away to an emergency situation on another PPS school campus.

activities and on-the- bike practice. Students will develop essential skills that teach how to adjust helmets for proper fit, use of hand signals, street signs interpretation and how to maneuver safely through intersections and out of driveways. The goal is to empower students and keep them safe while traveling in their neighborhood and surrounding streets.

A permission slip will be sent home mid April which requires a parent or legal guardian signature for participation; All signed permission slips should be returned to Ms. Smith A.S.A.P. Participants who intend to use their own bicycle or helmet must agree to have them inspected by me, Ms. Smith, **before** the program begins. I am available between April 10-27, 2018 from 8:00-9:00 a.m. and 3:45-4:00 p.m. for inspections except Tuesday afternoons. If personal equipment is determined to be unsafe, then participants will be required to use equipment provided by the program or get the needed repairs done prior to beginning the program. Note: All personal bikes require a bike lock in order to secure them to bike racks during school hours. **Please do not leave bikes overnight!**

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## **SafeOregon Tip Line**

### **The SafeOregon Tip Line aims to increase student safety**

In keeping with our commitment to student safety, last October PPS joined school districts across the state in using the SafeOregon Tip Line. We want to remind you about this important resource.

SafeOregon was funded by the Oregon Legislature as part of a statewide effort to improve school safety. It provides a secure means for anyone to anonymously report suspicious or imminently unsafe situations, such as threats of violence, fights, drugs and alcohol, weapons, bullying, harassment, intimidation or self-harm.

Anyone, from students to parents to community members, can access the system in a variety of ways, including:
