C.O.R.E. Compliment Store

You Can Help Teachers Motivate Beaumont Students to Be the Best They Can Be!

This year teachers are giving more and more compliments to students at Beaumont every day- for doing the right thing without being told. It's a fun and tangible way to reward kids who are making good choices at school- using something called "CORE Compliments."

When a teacher or staff member sees a student demonstrating Beaumont CORE values- C for Collaboration; O for Organization; R for Responsibility and E for Empathy- that student gets a Compliment, which are coupons that kids can redeem at the student store for snacks, treats and cool school supplies. It seems to be working! Students have been redeeming them so much that we are nearly out of treats for them! We are asking for packaged treats, like Rice Crispies and other snacks, or Costco gift cards, or cash. Please help us inspire the children through positive reinforcement
