

**BottleDrop** – Did you know Oregon BottleDrop centers offer an easy way to donate your \$0.10 deposits to charitable organizations? There are two easy ways to donate:

- 1. Sign up for an account at <u>www.bottledropcenters.com</u>, collect your cans and bottles, then click the **Give link** after logging into your account to transfer your funds to **Beaumont PTA**.
- 2. <u>Contact us</u> and we'll coordinate a way to get you BottleDrop blue fundraising bags. Fill them up. Drop them off at a participating location (e.g., Hollywood Fred Meyers or Safeway on NE Sandy). These bags are tagged and directly linked to the **Beaumont PTA** account, so there is no need to set up your own account.

We've set a fundraising goal of \$60,000 for this year, which is equivalent to \$115 per student. We are currently at \$10,000. Let's work together to reach our

goal. We will keep you informed of our progress throughout the year. **Keep Beaumont strong!**
