



Students Must Have Current Immunizations By February 19

Immunizations are required by state law for children and students in attendance at public and private schools, preschools, childcare facilities and Head Start programs in Oregon. Nearly every facility that provides care for a child outside the home requires immunizations or a medical or non-medical exemption to stay enrolled. If you do not meet state immunization requirements, you will receive a letter stating that your children must be immunized or will not be admitted to school starting on the school exclusion date.

La ley estatal exige vacunas para niños y estudiantes que asisten a escuelas públicas y privadas, centros preescolares, guarderías y programas Head Start en Oregon. Casi todas las instalaciones que brindan atención a un niño fuera del hogar requieren vacunas o una exención médica o no médica para permanecer inscrito. Si no cumple con los requisitos estatales de vacunación, recibirá una carta indicando que sus hijos deben estar vacunados o que no serán admitidos a la escuela a partir de la fecha de exclusión escolar.
