Outlook and Action for School Funding

On Thursday, the Joint Committee on Ways and Means released a proposed budget framework that falls \$100 million short of the funding necessary to maintain current service levels. Failing to provide \$8.97B for K-12 schools as proposed in [Governor Brown's 2019-2021 budget](#) translates to a loss of 4 instructional days per year statewide or the loss of 900 teachers across our state.

PPS Superintendent Guadalupe Guerrero announced in his February 26 e-mail to parents, "there will have to be school-based cuts to balance the budget." What can you do about it? Lots!

1. **Call or write your legislators today and ask them to BE BOLD!** We need the Oregon legislature to BE BOLD and enact the revenue reform that will enable fully funding our schools. **NOT SURE who your elected legislators are?** Visit the [state website](#) where you can enter your street address to determine who represents your family in the OR legislature.

2. Stand with educators as they make their voices heard. Actions are planned for April 10 and May 8. Email [Beaumont's PTA](#) for more information and details about participating in these actions.
