

YEARBOOK INFORMATION!!

Attention 8th grade parents if you are interested in submitting a baby ad, you have until February 15th to do this. **TIME IS RUNNING OUT!** It has become more and more of a tradition here at Beaumont with each year more and more ads, so don't delay, submit today. I will not be able to extend the deadline this year. Here's what I'll need:
Baby Ad Process

1. Find an adorable photo of your 8th grader as a baby / toddler.
2. Get the photo to Ms. Bennett; either hard copy via her mailbox in the Beaumont office OR email as an attachment: BeaumontsYearbook@gmail.com
3. Include a message on the back of the photo or in the body of the email. Maximum of 3 simple sentences, better if it's less than 2. (20 words is too much, it ends up covering the photo of your adorable baby.)
4. Pay for the ad \$15. I prefer the payment to be made through Schoolpay.com OR noted on the bottom of my Yearbook order forms found in the front office. Simply write "purchased baby ad" on the "white space" at the bottom, this is also a great place to submit your message if you're not doing digital. (School pay IS SET UP FOR BABY ADS!) I don't count the ad as purchased until the money is documented.

5. If hardcopy please include a phone number to contact you so that you can pick up the photo.
6. Please note that I work on the ads in February and will be in contact with you about details, if needed, at that time.

Our award winning Yearbooks are on sale for \$22. I'm fully supporting the school pay method. Please go onto your school pay account and purchase a yearbook that way, you'll be able to view your payment.

If you would rather submit a form from the front office to Ms. Bennett's box, that's a great process as well or have your student give it to Ms. Bennett (room 213).

Please note that if your student has a yearbook purchased by Feb. 28, I do everything within my power to guarantee a photo in the book, beyond the traditional school photo. So purchasing early is a bonus. Yearbook prices increase will be increasing as the year goes on!

Dear Beaumont Families,

Currently there is a high rate of colds, flu, and other common illnesses being reported in our community. These seasonal viruses can affect both children and adults.

Please take a few moments to go over the following information with your child:

- Do not share food, drinks, or personal items.
- Cover your cough, wash your hands.
- Cough or sneeze into the elbow bend of the arm or into a tissue then wash your hands.
- Wash your hands after recess or gym, before eating or preparing food, after using the restroom, blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.

Hand washing is the most effective way to keep germs from entering our bodies. To wash your hands effectively use plenty of soap and water; scrub the palms of hands, fingernails, around wrists, between fingers, and under rings for 30 seconds. Rinse well and dry hands after washing.

You will be asked to take your child home if there is:

- A new or sudden onset of a rash, or unusual marks on the skin, with or without fever.
- Skin lesions or sores that are "weepy" or draining, and cannot be covered with a bandage.
- A fever of 100.5 degrees or higher.
- Vomiting.
- Diarrhea.

Most illnesses are short lived without complications. However more serious conditions may develop. If you have any concerns about your child's health please contact your health care provider. If you need information about health insurance please contact your school nurse or call 503-257-1732.

Students may return to school after they have been without fever or vomiting or diarrhea for at least 24 hours, without the use of fever reducing, or other medication to relieve symptoms.
