### **PROMOTION REVERSE PARADE**

Who: Promoting 8th grade students and their families

When: Friday, June 11th from 5:30-6:00 p.m.

Where: Beaumont Middle School campus. Teachers will be lining the Fremont side of the building between 42nd and the visitor parking lot.

Advised Route (for cars): We encourage families to drive by the building from east to west and to seat promoting students on the passenger side of vehicles so they will be able to see staff and signs. See the Parade Route map on the next page for a graphic representation of the route.

Advised Route (for pedestrians): We encourage families to walk down Fremont from east to west on the sidewalk opposite the school (on the south side of the road) to help maintain social distancing. See the Parade Route map on the next page for a graphic representation of the route.

#### SAFETY MEASURES

To ensure the safety of staff, students, and families, we are asking that all participants follow all of the below listed safety measures:

- 1. Teachers will wear masks and will be standing at least six feet apart along the Fremont side of Beaumont.
- 2. Students and families should remain in their cars and follow the rules of the road.
- Please do not pull over, stop or drive slower than the posted speed limit.
- 4. Beaumont parking lots are closed to families.
- Students and families attending the parade on foot should use the sidewalk on the south side of Fremont to help maintain appropriate distancing. Please use crosswalks appropriately.
- 6. At no point should any students or families congregate in groups or approach/walk by teachers.
- 7. The reverse parade will shut down if all safety measures are not followed.

#### Now accepting applications for the 2021 PPS Summer Arts Academy

Portland Public Schools is excited to announce the <u>2021 Summer Arts</u> <u>Academy</u> on August 9-20 at Harriet Tubman Middle School. This academy is free and open to **rising 6th-9th grade** students attending school in the McDaniel, Jefferson and Roosevelt cluster neighborhoods, and students attending Beaumont (from Rigler), Harriet Tubman, Kellogg (from Lent) and Lane middle schools in fall 2021.

Students will have the opportunity to engage in Dance, Music (choir, band, orchestra, jazz), Visual Arts, Theatre, and Technical Theatre with additional minor classes. Prioritization will be given to students who qualify for free and reduced lunch. These details are all subject to change based on COVID-19 guidelines from the state of Oregon. Transportation and meal service will be provided.
