# Back-to-School Night

Sellwood Middle School will hold our Back-to-School Night on Wednesday, September 11<sup>th</sup>, from 6:30 to 8:00 PM. #### P.E.A.K. After School Program

In partnership with PTA, PEAK (Panther Enrichment and Academic Knowledge) is a series of afterschool classes open to all Sellwood Middle School (SMS) students. The majority of classes run on an 11 week session schedule in the fall, winter, and spring. Classes meet one to two times a week after school at SMS. Individual classes require a fee for participation. The fee covers class supplies and instructor fees. Scholarships are available as the PTA and PEAK goal is to include every SMS student. There is always the opportunity to contribute to the scholarship fund if you desire. Parent volunteers are welcome. All programs are supervised exclusively by PTA.

Registration is simple and can be done one of two ways. You can either fill out the paper form and return it to the box in the office marked PEAK along with a check made out to Sellwood PTA or visit the PTA/PEAK website below for a complete list of classes, full registration, and the option to pay electronically through the PTA SchoolPay, which is under the Nonprofit Groups on Schoolpay.
