Lincoln is proud of being Oregon's first public high school, established in 1869. Throughout this history, Lincoln students have demonstrated active engagement, leadership, care and a keen curiosity about the world around them, working for real change and improvement in society. Lincoln moved into its fully rebuilt, state of the art, site in the fall of 2022. Lincoln is known for its dedicated teachers, long-serving school administration, and strong athletic and extracurricular programs.

Lincoln's prime downtown location allows for key partnerships and easy access to PSU, the Portland Art Museum, Portland government, the Oregon Historical Society, OHSU, and a host of internships and other work and educational opportunities. All students receive free TriMet passes allowing for further field trips and easy use of public transportation, with Max and bus lines just steps from the school doors.

Lincoln is an International Baccalaureate (IB) School with a successful diploma program in 11th and 12th grades since 1991. Currently, all Lincoln students take at least three IB classes before they graduate. In support of our IB for all aspirations, Lincoln anticipates authorization as a Middle Years Program (MYP) by the end of the 2024-25 school year which will enable us to expand IB to 9th and 10th grade.
