



Contracted Licensed Child Care During Distance Learning



We are pleased to announce that our partner organizations will offer licensed child care this Fall. These contracted providers will operate fee-based child care programs in 9 schools, opening in phases in late September. Each school will enroll 2 small groups of 15 students. Programs offer distance learning support and enrichment for children ages 5-12. Organizations reserve 50% of the spaces for families qualifying for State subsidies. After 2 weeks, if these spaces have not been filled, providers will open them up to the community.

A state subsidy is financial assistance for qualifying families needing child care.
