In May 2021, President Joe Biden designated May 5th as Missing and Murdered Indigenous Persons Awareness Day to recognize American Indian and Alaska Native people who have lost their lives to violence. This and previous national acknowledgements of missing and murdered Indigenous women (MMIW) and missing and murdered Indigenous persons (MMIP) began with tribal advocates and allies who created ceremonies to honor those lost and who took action to advocate for changes to federal, state, and local policy. - <u>WeRNative.org</u>
