TAG Transition for 2012/13	 Changeover will occur July 1. Kimberly will be at the BESC and will be taking over some responsibilities for TAG, along with the two assistant directors from T&L. Kimberly is a huge advocate for TAG. Roxanne will stay on as a TAG Achievement Coordinator. We're not sure where the TAG Office will be located but TAG office will move as a group. Melissa and Kimberly will listen tonight and will meet with Pat in the next few weeks to discuss plans for TAG next year. Free flow of issues important to this council: Mark posed the question to Melissa: What do you see as the role of the TAGAC? Melissa mentioned the social/emotional issues, services, racial equity in all areas of TAG, and working hand-in-hand with the district to shape TAG in the district as to what is happening in the classroom. She wants to hear the TAGAC priorities. She likes the idea of a TAG survey to help set priorities for both of us. Brenda Ray: Budget, enrichment, differentiation in classroom- specifically ability grouping are issues she would like to see addressed. Realization: We need to have common ideas of what differentiation strategies are; to help us decide what is and what isn't 	focus for next year. (Ongoing support for communication – facilitated by the districtHow do you want your voice heard?) We need guidance from the district when we talk about this ongoing issue. Parent/student survey: Melissa and Kimberly will look at some examples for the team. Timeline: sent out by June 30. It will be sent to TAGAC members 3 weeks before June 30. O Will a survey help us set priorities or should the survey be simply reflective of how parents feel about TAG services in PPS schools? O Maybe do a follow-up survey next year to get more/different feedback.
