Charters and Community-Based Alternative Programs do not necessarily use the PPS Nutrition Services Program and FCN numbers shown may be lower than actual, and are preliminary until they have been reviewed by those programs.

LEP

Limited English Proficient (LEP) is the count of students eligible to receive English as a Second Language (ESL) or Bilingual Services. (Source: Synergy)

SpEd

Special Education (SpEd) is the count of students at each school with records flagged indicating participation in Individualized Education Plans (IEP), that is Special Education program students. (Source: Synergy)

TAG

Talented and Gifted enrollment is the count of students identified as academically talented, intellectually gifted or TAG potential, as measured by Talented and Gifted criteria. (Source: Synergy)
