October 2020 Enrollment Summaries are based on enrollment on October 1st as reported in the Period 1 Cumulative Average Daily Membership State Report and student information system (SIS). Students receiving Special Education services only who are not regularly attending, but are in the student information system (SIS), are excluded from the enrollment summaries.

Program type (i.e., elementary, middle, high, etc.) reflects the grade-span of the Schools in that particular year. Schools changing grade-spans and Program Types artificially inflate the Change calculations. See School Detail and Footnotes for more information about the specific Schools that changed. In recent years enrollment counts are compiled on or about the first school day of October. An enrolled student is defined as a student who attends one or more schools or programs within the District. Regardless of the number of schools or programs attended, each student is counted only once; the counts are unduplicated. Schools and programs that are no longer in operation are designated as "closed."

- (1) In 2020-21 all students attended virtually due to the coronavirus pandemic and need to keep the buildings closed.
- (2) Effective 2020-21, Wilson HS renamed Ida B. Wells-Barnett.
- (3) Effective 2020-21, Madison renamed Leodis V. McDaniel.
- (4) Effective 2020-21, Odyssey is being treated on reports as a stand alone site, separate from Hayhurst.
- (5) Effective 2019-20, Madison and Grant had a boundary change, with Rose City Park and Roseway Heights solely feeding Madison.
- (6) Effective 2019-20, Madison moved to the Marshall location for construction and is expected to return to the original site after construction is completed.
- (7) Effective 2019-20, Trillium closed.
- (8) Effective 2018-19, Boise-Eliot/Humboldt, MLK Jr, Irvington, and Sabin became K-5's, with the 6-8 grades from each school going to Harriet Tubman, a new middle school opened in 2018-19.
- (9) Effective 2018-19, Roseway Heights reconfigured from a K-8 to a Middle School, with 6-8 students coming from Roseway Heights, Scott, Lee, and Vestal. Scott, Lee, and Vestal became K-5's. Rose City Park opened as a new elementary school, with K-5 students coming from Roseway Heights, including the Vietnamese Immersion Program. Two boundary changes were made which redirected some Rose City Park students to Lee and some Lee students to Rose City Park.
- (10) Effective 2018-19, Beverly Cleary had a boundary change, resulting in some K-4 students being reassigned to Irvington and Rose City Park.
- (11) Effective 2018-19, Rigler is an immersion only school, with the neighborhood students being reassigned to Scott.
- (12) Effective 2018-19, Access moves to Vestal and Lane. Grades 1-5 attend Access @ Vestal and grades 6-8 attend Access @ Lane.
- (13) Effective 2017-18, Grant moved to the Marshall location for construction and is expected to return to the original site in 2 years.
- (14) Effective 2017-18, a boundary change assigned the Chief Joseph E.S. catchment area north of N Lombard St and west of I-5 to Peninsula E.S.
- (15) Effective 2017-18, Self Enhancement Academy closed
- (16) Effective 2017-18, Maplewood Elementary feeds to Jackson Middle School. Students residing in the area of Bridlemile E.S. feeding to Gray M.S. feed to Wilson for high school; students residing in the area of Bridlemile E.S. feeding to West Sylvan M.S. continue to feed to Lincoln H.S.
- (17) Effective 2017-18, the Odyssey program moved to the East Sylvan building, rather than being co-located with the Hayhurst neighborhood program in the Hayhurst building.
- (18) Effective 2016-17, Bridlemile E.S. became a split feeder to West Sylvan and Gray Middle Schools
- (19) Effective 2015-16, Franklin and Faubion moved locations for construction and return to original sites in 2017-18
- (20) Effective 2016-17, "New Avenues for Youth" and "Outside In" no longer contracted with PPS

- (21) Effective 2016-17, Self Enhancement Academy does not serve 6th grade.
- (22) Effective 2016-17, Ockley Green re-opened as a middle school, 5th grade from Chief Joseph remained in the Ockley Green building for 2016-17. Effective 2016-17, Beach became a K-5, Chief Joseph became a K-4, Peninsula became a K-5, Woodlawn became a K-5. Effective 2017-18, Chief Joseph became a K-5 and Ockley Green became a 6-8.
- (23) Effective 2013-14, Chief Joseph and Ockley Green merged to form Chief Joseph/Ockley Green K-8.
- (24) Effective 2012-13, Humboldt closed. Students from Humboldt neighborhood now attend Boise-Eliot/Humboldt.
- (25) Effective 2012-13, Young Women's Leadership Academy closed.
- (26) Effective 2011-12, Marshall closed. Students in the Harrison Park K-8 School area attend Madison High School. Students in the Kelly and Woodmere Elementary School areas, and the Bridger, Lent and Marysville K-8 areas, attend Franklin High School. Students in the Whitman Elementary School area attend Cleveland High School.
- (27) Effective 2011-12, students in the Jefferson cluster have the choice to attend either the new Jefferson Middle College program or a neighborhood comprehensive high school program at Roosevelt, Madison or Grant, depending on where they live within the Jefferson cluster boundaries.
- (28) For the 2011-12 school year, Rigler neighborhood 7th and 8th graders attended Vernon.
- (29) Effective 2010-11, Clarendon-Portsmouth was renamed César Chávez.
- (30) Effective 2008-09, Binnsmead closed and the Clark School students and staff moved from the Clark site to the Binnsmead site. The school was renamed Harrison Park. The Creative Science School Program (CSSP) expanded and moved from Bridger Elementary to the Clark site.
- (31) ACCESS is a district-wide alternative education program. Starting in 2013-14, it is located at the Rose City Park site.
- (32) In 2009-10 Scott and Rigler became K-8 schools. Effective 2008-09, Scott and Rigler remained K-7 schools, and those students that matriculated from 7th to 8th grade attended at the Madison 8th grade academy.

- (33) Effective 2007-08, Clarendon ES and Portsmouth MS merged to form a K-8 school. Enrollment counts for years prior to 2007-08 for Clarendon consist of grades K-5 only. Enrollment counts for Portsmouth prior to 2007-08 are contained in the MS section of this report. Similarly, Hollyrood ES and Fernwood MS merged to form a K-8 school (renamed Beverly Cleary) as did Rose City Park ES and Gregory Heights MS (renamed Roseway Heights).
- (34) Effective 2007-08, Kellogg MS was closed. Eighth grade students that would have been enrolled at Kellogg for the 2007-08 school year were enrolled at Franklin HS. Tubman MS was also closed and a new Young Women's Academy was opened on the Tubman campus as part of Jefferson High School.
- (35) Transitioned to K-8. In 2009-10 Laurelhurst, Rigler, Scott became K-8 schools. In 2008-09 Arleta, Astor, Boise-Eliot, Bridger, Clark, Creston, Faubion, Humboldt, Irvington, Lee, Lent, Marysville, Peninsula, Sabin, Skyline, Vestal, Woodlawn became K-8 schools. In 2007-08 Beach, Clarendon-Portsmouth, Beverly Cleary, King, Roseway Heights, Vernon became K-8 schools.
- (36) Day and Residential Treatment Programs (long-term care and treatment).
- (37) Applegate, Edwards, Kenton, Richmond and Smith Elementary Schools were closed at the end of the 2004-05 school year. Whitaker Middle school was closed as well. Most elementary school-aged students residing in the Applegate neighborhood area went on to attend Woodlawn. Similarly, students residing in the Edwards neighborhood area went on to attend Abernethy, those at Kenton to Chief Joseph; those at Richmond to Abernethy, Creston or Glencoe; and those at Smith went on to Capitol Hill, Maplewood or Markham. Most middle school students residing in the Whitaker neighborhood area went on to attend Tubman. A new focus/option school was established at the Richmond ES site.
- (38) The Pioneer program consists of elementary, middle and high school programs. It was formerly known as ES B Program at Youngson, MS B Program at Foster and HS B Program at Columbia.
- (39) LEP Charter Closed end of 2014-15 school year.
