

Portland Public Schools Enrollment Summaries October, 2006

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Introduction

This summary report is a profile of current and historical enrollments for Portland Public Schools. Included are various summaries of these data, e.g., by school/program, grade level, ethnicity, and gender.

Enrollment counts are compiled on or about the first of October. An enrolled student is defined as a student who attends one or more schools or programs within the District. Regardless of the number of schools or programs attended, each student is counted only once; the counts are unduplicated.
