October Enrollment Summaries are based on enrollment on the first weekday in October as reported in the student information system (SIS).

Students receiving Special Education services only who are not regularly attending, but are in the student information system (SIS), are excluded from the enrollment summaries.

Program type (i.e., elementary, middle, high, etc.) reflects the grade-span of the Schools in that particular year. Schools changing grade-spans and Program Types artificially inflate the Change calculations. See School Detail and Footnotes for more information about the specific Schools that changed. In recent years enrollment counts are compiled on or about the first school day of October. An enrolled student is defined as a student who attends one or more schools or programs within the District. Regardless of the number of schools or programs attended, each student is counted only once; the counts are unduplicated. Schools and programs that are no longer in operation are designated as "closed."

- (1) Effective 2022-23, DePaul Center, Morrison Breakthrough, and Nickerson Adolescent D.T. closed.
- (2) Effective 2022-23, Parry Center and Parry Center SCIP merged and are now Souther School, Parry Center SCIP was renamed to Edwards, and Morrison Counterpoint was renamed to
- (3) Students attending the Teen Parent Program are primarily shown under the School/Program they attend, as Teen Parent Program is not the primary education entity. Students receive supplemental services from the Teen Parent Program.
- (4) Effective 2022-23, Access moves to the Terwiliger site (all grades).
- (5) Effective 2021-22, Arleta, Creston, Lent, and Marysville became K-5's, with the 6-8 grades from each school going to Kellogg, which opened as a new middle school.
- (6) Effective 2021-22, Bridger became a K-5, with the 6-8 grades going to Harrison Park.
- (7) Effective 2021-22, the Portland International Scholars Academy program moved from Benson to McDaniel and Roosevelt.
- (8) Effective 2021-22, Online Learning Academy opened, as a fully virtual K-12 program.
- (9) Effective 2021-22, Opal Charter School and John's Landing School closed.
- (10) Effective 2021-22, McDaniel returned to it's original site and Benson moved to Marshall and is expected to return to the original site after construction is complete.
- (11) In 2020-21 all students attended virtually due to the coronavirus pandemic and need to keep the buildings closed.
- (12) Effective 2020-21, Wilson HS renamed Ida B. Wells-Barnett.
- (13) Effective 2020-21, Madison renamed Leodis V. McDaniel.
- (14) Effective 2020-21, Odyssey is being treated on reports as a stand alone site, separate from Hayhurst.
- (15) Effective 2019-20, Madison and Grant had a boundary change, with Rose City Park and Roseway Heights solely feeding Madison.
- (16) Effective 2019-20, Madison moved to the Marshall location for construction and is expected to return to the original site after construction is completed.
- (17) Effective 2019-20, Trillium closed.
- (18) Effective 2018-19, Boise-Eliot/Humboldt, MLK Jr, Irvington, and Sabin became K-5's, with the 6-8 grades from each school going to Harriet Tubman, a new middle school opened in 2018-19.
- (19) Effective 2018-19, Roseway Heights reconfigured from a K-8 to a Middle School, with 6-8 students coming from Roseway Heights, Scott, Lee, and Vestal. Scott, Lee, and Vestal became K-5's. Rose City Park opened as a new elementary school, with K-5 students coming from Roseway Heights, including the Vietnamese Immersion Program. Two boundary changes were made which redirected some Rose City Park students to Lee and some Lee students to Rose City Park.
- (20) Effective 2018-19, Beverly Cleary had a boundary change, resulting in some K-4 students being reassigned to Irvington and Rose City Park.
- (21) Effective 2018-19, Rigler is an immersion only school, with the neighborhood students being reassigned to Scott.
- (22) Effective 2018-19, Access moves to Vestal and Lane. Grades 1-5 attend Access @ Vestal and grades 6-8 attend Access @ Lane.
- (23) Effective 2017-18, Grant moved to the Marshall location for construction and is expected to return to the original site in 2 years.
- (24) Effective 2017-18, a boundary change assigned the Chief Joseph E.S. catchment area north of N Lombard St and west of I-5 to Peninsula E.S.
- (25) Effective 2017-18, Self Enhancement Academy closed
- (26) Effective 2017-18, Maplewood Elementary feeds to Jackson Middle School. Students residing in the area of Bridlemile E.S. feeding to Gray M.S. feed to Wilson for high school; students residing in the area of Bridlemile E.S. feeding to West Sylvan M.S. continue to feed to Lincoln H.S.
- (27) Effective 2017-18, the Odyssey program moved to the East Sylvan building, rather than being co-located with the Hayhurst neighborhood program in the Hayhurst building.
- (28) Effective 2016-17, Bridlemile E.S. became a split feeder to West Sylvan and Gray Middle Schools
- (29) Effective 2015-16, Franklin and Faubion moved locations for construction and return to original sites in 2017-18
- (30) Effective 2016-17, "New Avenues for Youth" and "Outside In" no longer contracted with PPS
- (31) Effective 2016-17, Self Enhancement Academy does not serve 6th grade.
- (32) Effective 2016-17, Ockley Green re-opened as a middle school, 5th grade from Chief Joseph remained in the Ockley Green building for 2016-17. Effective 2016-17, Beach became a K-5, Chief Joseph became a K-4, Peninsula became a K-5, Woodlawn became a K-5. Effective 2017-18, Chief Joseph became a K-5 and Ockley Green became a 6-8.
- (33) Effective 2013-14, Chief Joseph and Ockley Green merged to form Chief Joseph/Ockley Green K-8.
