Focus/Alternative, Community-based Alternative and Special Services Administered programs do not have assigned geographic enrollment areas; rather these programs draw students from the entire District. In the neighborhood area with a K-8 conversion, in general, the assigned neighborhood for the 6th, 7th and 8th grade will be the school converting to K-8 up to the highest grade offered.

Starting the 2005-06 SY, school closures are incorportated: Woodlawn includes the 2004 Applegate attendance area; Abernethy includes 2004 Edwards attendance area; Abernethy, Creston and Glencoe share the 2004 Richmond attendance area; the former Edwards and Richmond portions of Abernethy area became the Cleveland HS HS attendance area and no longer Franklin HS; Chief Joseph includes 2004 Kenton attendance area; Capitol Hill, Markham and Maplewood share the 2004 Smith attendance area; Tubman and Beaumont share the 2004 Whitaker attendance area.

Focus/Alternative programs that reside in a neighborhood school have been shown with the neighborhood school. These are Buckman, Sunnyside, Odyssey, Access, Ockley Green K-5, and Language Immersion programs. Alliance HS at Madison and Marshall (Formerly Madison Focus and Marshall Night HS) has enrollment shown in Alliance HS.

Alliance High School is comprised of Meek Professional Technical, Portland Night High School at Grant, Marshall Night High School and Madison Focus Program.
