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



Beginning 2004-05, stability was determined instead based on a student being enrolled at least 145 days at a school, which is aproximately 85% of the school year.

The revised method better accommodates non-standard school calendars, seniors who graduate (and quit attending) in May, and 'short' breaks in educational service.

Lee, Rigler, Rose City Park and Scott

In the neighborhood area with a K-8 conversion, in general, the assigned neighborhood for the 6th, 7th and 8th grade will be the school converting to K-8 up to the highest grade offered.

Starting the 2005-06 SY, school closures are incorportated: Woodlawn includes the 2004 Applegate attendance area; Abernethy includes 2004 Edwards attendance area; Abernethy, Creston and Glencoe share the 2004 Richmond attendance area; the former Edwards and Richmond portions of Abernethy area became the Cleveland HS HS attendance area and no longer Franklin HS; Chief Joseph includes 2004 Kenton attendance area; Capitol Hill, Markham and Maplewood share the 2004 Smith attendance area; Tubman and Beaumont share the 2004 Whitaker attendance area.

Focus/Alternative programs that reside in a neighborhood school have been shown with the neighborhood school. These are Buckman, Sunnyside, Odyssey, Access, Ockley Green K-5, and Language Immersion programs. Alliance HS at Madison and Marshall (Formerly Madison Focus and Marshall Night HS) has enrollment shown in Alliance HS.

Alliance High School is comprised of Meek Professional Technical, Portland Night High School at Grant, Marshall Night High School and Madison Focus Program.



For <u>allocation</u> purposes, licensed equivalents are used for comparison purposes. For this calculation, two (2) classified FTE is equivalent to one (1) licensed FTE. Allocations are shown as licensed equivalent so that comparisons can be made across schools. Since principals choose different balances between teachers (licensed) and educational assistants (classified), a common measure – FTE in licensed equivalents is applied to allocate and compare resources across schools.

General Fund Staffing Allocations are based on each school's average enrollment – Average Daily Membership, adjusted for projected demographic trends, and school reconfigurations. General Fund allocations were divided into three categories –

<u>Administrative Support FTE</u> provides for Principal/Assistant Principals and Secretaries, and Counselors (depending on type and size of school);

Ratio FTE based on a student to teacher ratio that varies by school level (elementary schools and multilevel schools 23.5:1; middle schools 23.5:1; and high schools 22.7:1);

<u>SES FTE</u> a socio-Economic Status Factor by which five percent of the FTE allocation is determined as an increasing function the percentage of students at each school who are eligible for Free or Reduced Price Meals under federal nutrition service program guidelines.

Additional allocations shown as <u>One Time Adjustments</u> were made based on special circumstances or particular need. These include FTE allocations designated by the Office of Schools to facilitate reconfiguration and to deal with other special circumstances.

These first several categories are funded by general funds of the district. The remainder of the staffing information shown represents positions funded by Grant and Special Revenue sources that have special purposes and restrictions on use.

Tabor and Cleveland; Mandarin Immersion programs at Woodstock, Hosford and Cleveland; Russian Immersion program at Kelly; Spanish Immersion programs located at Ainsworth, Atkinson, Beach, Bridger, Clarendon, Cleveland, Hosford, Lent, Lincoln, Rigler and West Sylvan. Not all special focus programs at high schools are included here due to shortcomings of the data.

When a neighborhood student attends a special program/focus option that is located at their neighborhood school, they are counted as attending their neighborhood school. For example, if a Hayhurst neighborhood student attends Odyssey program at Hayhurst, they are counted as attending Hayhurst rather than as attending a special program/focus option. This assumption is applied to Odyssey at Hayhurst and ACCESS at Sabin, Buckman Arts, Sunnyside

Environmental School, as well as Language Immersion programs located in Neighborhood Schools.

Neighborhood calculations for Roosevelt and Marshall campuses are at the campus rather than the small school level.

<u>PPS Charter Schools</u> – Number and percentage of the neighborhood student population attending one of the District Charter schools: Arthur Academy, CM2's Opal School, Emerson Public Charter, Leadership and Entrepreneurship High School, Portland Village School, Self Enhancement Academy or Trillium Public Charter.

<u>Special Services</u> – Number and percentage of the neighborhood student population attending special education administered programs not in schools, day and residential treatment, and other special services.

<u>Community Based Alternative Programs</u> – Number and percentage of the neighborhood student population attending contract based alternative programs such as Albina Youth Opportunity School, DePaul Center, LISTOS, Mt. Scott Park Center for Learning, NAYA Early College Academy, New Avenues for Youth, Open Meadow, various PCC programs, Quest Schools, POIC, YouthBuilders, and others.

## 4. Educational Programs

Achievement Scores – Percent Meeting or Exceeding Benchmarks
Two year history for Reading and Math test results for third, fifth, eighth and tenth grades as compiled in Portland Public Schools Research and
Evaluation/Adequate Yearly Progress Reports. The scores for determining which students meet standards changed in 2006-07. The change made it harder for elementary students to meet/exceed standards, easier at high schools, and about the same for middle schools students. In order that comparisons between years are made on a consistent basis, the scores shown for 2005-06 are recalibrated using the 2006-07 standards. In other words, the scores shown for 2005-06 were recalculated to show what they would have been had the new standards been applied in that year. As a result, the percentage meeting and exceed for 2005-06 may be different from the percentages shown in last year's Enrollment Profiles. http://www.pps.k12.or.us/depts-c/rne/results/2007/

#### 5. School Environment

This section contains several measures new to the Enrollment Profiles this year. These statistical measures summarize important indicators of factors that make up the school environment. In each case two measures are shown: a measure of the school profiled and an average on this same measure across all schools in the relevant group. Thus each elementary school (PK/K-5) is compared to the average comprised of all elementary schools, each Multi-level school PK/K-8 or K-12 school is compared to the average across Multi level schools, each Middle School (6-8), against the Middle School average, and High Schools (9-12, 6-12) against the High School average. In the first year of a school merger (elementary and middle to form a K-8), the data for the elementary school are shown and compared with the elementary average. These are calculated on an annual basis and thus the numbers shown are for the 2006-07 school year.

<u>Highly Qualified Teaching Assignments.</u> Under federal government legislation associated with the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB), public school teachers must meet a set of standards associated with the level and type of subjects that they teach. The numbers shown indicate the percentage of core academic subject teaching assignments taught by highly qualified teachers at each school and a district average for similar schools. NCLB defines core academic subjects as English, Reading or Language Arts, Mathematics, Science, some World Languages (French, German, Spanish, Russian, Latin and Japanese), Social Studies, and the Arts.

<u>Teacher Experience</u>. This is the average number of years of teaching experience of teachers at each school and the average of similar schools in the District. Average years are weighted by the full time equivalent for each teacher. Thus a half-time teacher would be half-weighted in the calculation.

<u>Staff Attendance Rate.</u> This measure is not available at this time. However, it is being developed and will represent an average attendance rate computed in a manner similar to the Average Daily Student Attendance described below.

Average Daily Attendance. This number, derived from individual student data indicates the percentage of enrolled students who were present (in attendance) averaged across all school days during the school year. The Comparable District Average is the Average Daily Attendance for all schools in the comparable category (elementary, multi-level (PK/K-8, PK/K-12), Middle School or High School).

<u>Average Class Size.</u> This statistic for each school reflects the average number of students in homeroom or self contained classrooms (generally grades K-5, but sometimes also 6-8); or, for higher grades, on the average number of students in

classes defined as "core" subjects by NCLB (see Highly Qualified for listing of subjects).

Stability Index. This is a measure of students who are enrolled for at least 145 days of the school year (approximately 175 days) divided by the official October enrollment count. Students who are not enrolled for the full year include those students who enroll after the start of the school year, students who leave before the end of the school year, and students who are enrolled sporadically. Those schools with results closer to 100% are likely to have a more stable student population than those with a lower percentage. Another measure (not shown in the school Environment section, but shown in the summary tables in the District Summary section of this publication) identifies the amount of student mobility there is in a school, by calculating a *Late Enrollee Ratio*, which measures how many students arrive after the first day in October.

<u>Student Expulsions.</u> Number of students expelled during the school year as a percentage of October enrollment. The comparable district average is based on average expulsions for the school type as described above.

<u>Student Suspensions.</u> Number of students suspended from school during the school year as a percent of October enrollment. If one student were to be suspended more than one time, the count would not be duplicated. The comparable district average is based on the average suspensions for the school type as described above.

#### 6. Enrollment Indicators

These calculations are indicators that additional data and further review of the school may be needed.

<u>Declining Enrollment.</u> Student loss  $\geq$  5% since 2006 AND  $\geq$  15% since 2003? <u>Yes</u> if enrollment has declined by 5% or more compared to the prior year, accompanied by an enrollment decline of 15% or more over the past four years. No if enrollment has not met these conditions.

<u>Neighborhood Capture Rate.</u> Yes if the number of neighborhood students attending this school is less than 55% of Portland Public schools students who live within this school's neighborhood boundaries. No if 55% or more of neighborhood students attend this school.

<u>Density Index.</u> October 2007 Enrollment divided by Number of Classrooms. This is intended as an indicator of the classroom capacity of the building compared to the number of students using the physical space. A high number could indicate crowding; a low number might indicate potential excess capacity. This index is a broad indicator of capacity, and must be considered in light of actual space usage

for special education classes, computer labs, Head Start classrooms, ESL and Title 1.

Number of Classrooms. Actual number of "potential" classroom space in a school including classrooms housing standard education programs, other district programs, outside programs/partnerships, Special Education classes, English Language Learner classes, and vacant rooms. Generally this number is greater than the number of rooms used for standard classroom purposes. (Prepared by PPS Facilities and Asset Management, Classroom Use Survey, December 2004.)

<u>Building Density Index.</u> <u>Yes</u> if the school's enrollment divided by the number of classrooms is less than 15. <u>No</u> if the school's enrollment divided by the number of classrooms is 15 or greater.
