Dear Families,

I hope everyone is having a nice week. Our students and staff are without a doubt back into the swing of things. The Winter Assessment "window" opened this week and so all students have been working through several different assessments in literacy and math. Staff will use this data to help inform their instruction, make groupings, and provide feedback to students and families. As mentioned last week, families will receive progress reports on Friday, February 3rd.

School Safety (one of our four community values) has been at the forefront of many of our minds, especially in recent weeks and months. Starting this week, I will be visiting all classrooms to talk about safety and what that means here at Alameda. Specifically, the focus of our discussions is around what students and adults need to feel safe and what each of us can do to ensure that everyone feels safe.

I am compiling a list of ACTION items that we all can do to help Alameda be a more physically and emotionally safe community.

Here are a few themes that are beginning to emerge from my conversations this week:
 Friendship, Including others, trusted adults, being kind, playing fairly, saying hello/greeting people, being careful and mindful of our words and actions during recess, caring teachers, calmness, reassurance and understanding, respect

<u>Community Value Spotlight:</u> This week, let's take a closer look at kindness. When students, staff, and community members were asked to chime in about values, Kindness (and being Caring and Supportive) was by far the most mentioned ideal. When we speak of being "kind," we mean the small, yet significant things that each of us can do, every day, to make someone smile, feel welcomed, feel supported or connected to our community.

We also aspire to cultivate a school climate and culture that embodies kindness - where the collective needs and interests of our community are at the forefront of our daily decisions and actions. As is the case with all of Alameda's values, none of this will firmly take root without each of us doing our part. I have no reason to not be optimistic about our community living up to our newly adopted values - I see it everyday as our students and staff work together to solve problems and bring joy to one another. We need this now, more than ever. I thank you for the critical part you play in our child's growth and development.
