Quite a few Updates and Announcements:

School Photos: You should have received login information from your child's teacher to access the photographs that were taken at school. Halloween Costumes: Earlier this week I was handed a petition to allow costumes during a part of the school day on 10/31. Compliments to Hazel and Sadie, two fourth grade students, who gathered over 130 student signatures and 17 staff signatures. After conversation with staff and several community members, we have decided to allow students to wear costumes for a small portion of the day. In most cases this will be the last hour of the day, however, each grade level might make some adjustments - they will communicate directly with families.

Speaking of Costumes...Reminder: Alameda's first Halloween Costume Exchange! Drop off clean, gently used costumes in the box outside the office through October 17th. Then come find your child's new look on Thursday, October 19th from 3-6pm in the gym. No costume donation is required to participate. We do have the following guidelines so everyone can have a safe and joyful time: No masks, excessive gore/blood, or weapons of any kind. Students should be able to easily put on/take off their costume - perhaps it will be a scaled down version of what they intend to wear in the evening.

School Foundation Update: As many of you know, the PPS School Board is considering making changes to local school foundations. These changes would likely reduce funding at Alameda. On Wednesday evening, the PPS Board Policy Committee met and chose not to bring anything to a vote. Their plan is to slow down the process and spend time

gathering more data and input from the community. There will be a board "work session" on this topic on 10/17, and invite anyone interested in learning more to tune in.

Two members of our school community, Ella Robinson (1st grade teacher) and Katie Day (3rd grade parent) provided testimony at the meeting. We thank them for advocating on behalf of Alameda and all PPS Students. While I recognize this issue has become somewhat polarizing, I want to thank the many community members who have reached out to the school board to express their thoughts and opinions. It makes a difference and will ultimately provide a better experience for all students. Our hope is that Board members and PPS Leadership will make sure that all students in PPS receive enough funding for a quality education.
