Dear Families,

Happy Friday! I hope everyone's week has gone well. Last night we had our first Site Council Meeting of the year. A big thank you to those community members who have volunteered to be a member of this group. Our conversation focused on a number of topics including our School Wide Improvement Plan (a few highlights on these slides) and the value of educating and supporting the whole child. We also discussed the importance of paying close attention to the social/emotional and behavioral needs of our students. This is a big lift and calls for collaboration and strong connections between school, families, and students.

We also touched on the possibility of a strike, which as of today, appears to be more likely than not. As I said during our site council meeting, our teachers work incredibly hard to support our students and their work is increasingly challenging and never more important. It is my hope that PAT and PPS are able to reach an agreement that honors the complexities of being an educator in 2023. You should received information from PPS via email regarding other details about the possible strike.

Teachers and other staff have recently been speaking with students about the importance of safety/well-being on the playground. The climate and "feel" on the playground, at times, is overly competitive and exclusive. We are hearing and seeing critical language, chanting/taunting, and other comments that are not kind or inclusive or kind. In order for all students to feel the joy of recess, our students need to pay more attention to their interactions (and reactions) and how they are treating one another. These are critical lessons for our students and we thank you in advance for extending these important conversations beyond the school day.

On Wednesday we had our second fire drill of the year. Our students safely exited the building and proceeded to the field, which is our designated meeting area. We followed up our monthly fire drill with an earthquake drill on Thursday.

One final important safety note: Please DO NOT use NE 27th, between Fremont and Klickitat as a drop off area for your child, especially when the buses are still there. It becomes a very dangerous situation for families on bikes, on foot, and in cars. If you want to drop your child off, please use the North side of NE Klickitat, between NE 27th and NE 28th. There is less traffic and students can easily walk on the sidewalk as they make their way towards the doors.

<u>Counselor Corner:</u> Counselors are wrapping up Stop, Walk, Talk lessons and in grades K, 1, 2 we will be moving toward learning about emotional regulation and understanding feelings in ourselves and others. We will be focusing on specific feelings as well as The Zones of Regulation, which helps children first identify their feelings and then work to use coping strategies to get back to the green zone (the learning zone).

3rd and 4th grade lessons are focusing on empathy - what empathy looks like at Alameda and in our community. Lessons in 5th grade will focus on Growth Mindset, Grit and neuroplasticity. Please ask your child about these topics!

As always, please reach out to your child's counselor: Molly Clark (grades K,4,5) and Anna Tofel (grades 1,2,3) for support with social/emotional concerns for your child. If you would like your counselor to attend your child's conference please let us know.
