## **Updates and Announcements:**

- **Book Bank Drive:** Thanks to everyone who donated to the Share the Love of Reading book drive—Alameda collected 778 books for the Children's Book Bank!
- **Conferences:** Conferences have begun and will continue through mid-January. If you have not signed up for a time, please contact your child's teacher.
- Upcoming Service Learning Project: In celebration of the Lunar New Year on February 10, 2024, Alameda Elementary Library and our very eager 5th graders will be organizing a Community Food Drive. All food donations will help support the Community for Positive Aging (CfPA). CfPA is asking our community to donate culturally specific non-perishable foods for their AAPI elders.   - Food Collection from January 2, 2024 February 7, 2024
  - Students will drop off food donations at their classrooms in the designated Food Box or Bin.
  - CfPA Asian Food Pantry serves 225 people = 140 Households
  - 7 Asian Ethnicities = Chinese, Korean, Vietnamese, East Indian, Japanese, & Laosian.
  - Non-perishable foods included in donations that are not Asian specific will be allocated to CfPA's weekly food pantry programs.
- **Counselor Update:** In December and January, counselors are focusing their lessons on feelings identification, emotion regulation tools, and The Zones of Regulation. The Zones of Regulation is a school wide tool Alameda staff and students use to identify feelings. Ask your child about some of the strategies they can use to get back to the green zone (learning zone). Some of the tools we are teaching can be found here.
