LINCOLN HONOR CORDS

Advancement Via Individual Determination: Students who complete four years in the AVID program earn a teal, purple, silver or gold cord depending on number of years in the program. These students have completed a college preparatory curriculum focused on writing, inquiry, collaboration, organization and reading, enrolled in rigorous coursework including International Baccalaureate classes and have demonstrated a dedication to success in a global society.

Arabic Honor Society: Students wearing a teal and white entwined cord have completed 1.5 years of high school level Arabic, have a 3.5 GPA or higher in Arabic, and a 3.0 or higher overall GPA.

Black Student Union: The students who are wearing the kente cloth stoles are representing the Black Student Union. These students have engaged in a variety of community service projects and experiences.

Community Service: The students who are wearing a red and a white cord have demonstrated community service in and outside of the Lincoln Community. This includes Cards Cook, Period, Red Cross and Safer clubs.

CTE Program of Study Completer: The students wearing the entwined red, teal, and dark yellow cords have distinguished themselves in our programs in both academics and character. These students have completed the program and taken a skill assessment test. The Lincoln CTE Programs include Business & Management, Computer Science Tech, Design and Applied Arts, Hospitality & Tourism, Culinary Arts and Mass Communications.

International Baccalaureate: Full diploma candidates are wearing the official white satin IB Honor Stole. These students completed courses and took the IB exams in six IB subjects, completed the IB Diploma Core: Theory of Knowledge, Creativity Activity and Service, and the 4000 Word-Extended Essay.

Gender & Sexuality Alliance: Students who are wearing a lavender cord have shown commitment towards helping inform and educate the Lincoln community about gender and sexuality issues.

MEChA: Students wearing serape stoles are members of the national Latino student leadership organization, MEChA. These leaders are recognized for their dedication to raising cultural awareness around national and international Latinx issues, serving their community, and the pursuit of higher education.

National Honor Society: The students who are wearing a yellow cord are those who are members of the National Honor Society. They have maintained a cumulative 3.5 GPA. These students have been highly engaged in both school and community service.

PCC Dual Credit: Blue & yellow entwined **Performing Arts Honors:** The students who are wearing a pink cord have completed 4 years of the same performing art class during their high school years.

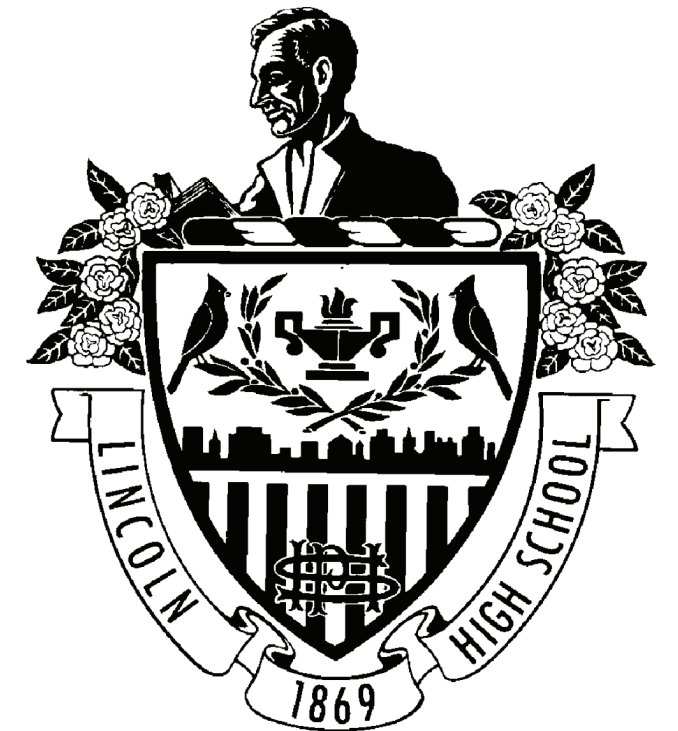
Seal of Bilingual: Medal on a blue ribbon for achieving a high mark on a state foreign language test.

T.T. DAVIS HONOR SCHOLARSHIP

Thompson T. Davis was principal of Lincoln High School from 1897 to 1923. He was the longest serving administrator in school history. It was during his tenure that the school changed its name from Portland High School to Lincoln High School in 1909. In 1912, Mr. Davis presided over the move into what is now Lincoln Hall at Portland State University. This award was established by the will of Minnie Davis Forsyth, widow of Mr. Davis. It is Lincoln High School's top academic honor.

RUTH ARBUCKLE AWARD

Ruth Arbuckle was a member of the Lincoln community for more than six decades, beginning with her enrollment as a freshman in 1917. The PTA established an award upon her retirement in 1971, and in 2018, Eled (Bud) Toly, a 1956 graduate, endowed an alumni association scholarship with priority consideration given to a student who chooses a 2- or 4-year public Oregon college or university. Miss Arbuckle devoted her life to Lincoln as a student, secretary, English teacher, and long-time college counselor. She gained national recognition from admissions panels for her guidance of students into the post-high school world. The criteria written by Miss Arbuckle and honored by Mr. Toly requests that the award be presented at commencement to the student who possesses a combination of the following qualities. Sustained academic interest, thoughtful concern for others and a warm regard for Lincoln High School

SUSAN PETTIT DRAGON SPIRIT AWARD

Mrs. Petit served the Lincoln community as a volunteer organizing other parents in giving service to the school. She was unselfish with her time, and students and staff sought her out for support and counsel. The award was established by Mrs. Petit's family following her death and honors the Chinese astrological belief that all powers of the earth are balanced between yin and yang. The dragon becomes the yang force and symbolizes action, energy, and movement. The dragon also is seen as larger than life, magnetic and decisive, and brutally frank.

MILLENIUM SCHOLARSHIP

The classes of 2000 and 2001 created this award. Each year, the Senior Class donates a portion of its money to this scholarship, thus keeping it a perpetual award. The intended recipient should be a student who works behind the scene in any and all school activities without ever seeking the spotlight.

BERTHA HUNTER FOREIGN LANGUAGE SCHOLARSHIP

Bertha Hunter began her career at Lincoln in 1923 as a foremost counselor, adviser, and teacher of Latin, French, English, and mathematics. She retired in 1952. Miss Hunter was known for her patience and for encouraging students to pursue a college education. One student, Rex James (Jim) Bates, Class of 1941, thought he wanted to attend Harvard but needed a Latin credit. Miss Hunter tutored him in the language and although he did not go to Harvard, he was able to fulfill his post-high dream of attending college. To honor Miss Hunter, Mr. Bates established the Bertha Hunter Language Scholarship in September, 2007. A true friend and supporter of Lincoln, Mr. Bates passed away in March, 2016.

BILL LYNCH MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Bill was a much beloved English teacher at Lincoln High School and was named teacher of the year, representing Portland, Oregon at a ceremony in Washington, DC. One school principal stated, "Bill was a legendary and impactful teacher who meant so much to hundreds/thousands of students and families." His students admired him for his empathy, his listening ear, his wit, his intellect, his true passion for ideas, and his love for helping students succeed, not only in his class, but also within themselves. The Lincoln High School Alumni Association Endowment is establishing an endowment scholarship honoring Bill Lynch (b. 2/1/1973 – 9/29/2019). This scholarship will be awarded to a senior student who shows an uncommon and authentic passion for the study of literature and philosophy; the type of student that Bill Lynch inspired.

T.T. DAVIS HONOR SCHOLARSHIP

Thompson T. Davis was principal of Lincoln High School from 1897 to 1923. He was the longest serving administrator in school history. It was during his tenure that the school changed its name from Portland High School to Lincoln High School in 1909. In 1912, Mr. Davis presided over the move into what is now Lincoln Hall at Portland State University. This award was established by the will of Minnie Davis Forsyth, widow of Mr. Davis. It is Lincoln High School's top academic honor.

RUTH ARBUCKLE AWARD

Ruth Arbuckle was a member of the Lincoln community for more than six decades, beginning with her enrollment as a freshman in 1917. The PTA established an award upon her retirement in 1971, and in 2018, Eled (Bud) Toly, a 1956 graduate, endowed an alumni association scholarship with priority consideration given to a student who chooses a 2- or 4-year public Oregon college or university. Miss Arbuckle devoted her life to Lincoln as a student, secretary, English teacher, and long-time college counselor. She gained national recognition from admissions panels for her guidance of students into the post-high school world. The criteria written by Miss Arbuckle and honored by Mr. Toly requests that the award be presented at commencement to the student who possesses a combination of the following qualities.
