Advanced Placement and Dual Credit Courses

Roosevelt students are encouraged to take Advanced Placement and Dual Credit when ready for the challenges of these classes. We offer courses in Language Arts, Mathematics, Fine Arts, Science, and Social Studies.

Spanish Immersion and World Languages

We offer rigorous Japanese and Spanish courses. Our Spanish Immersion program helps students develop reading, writing and oral fluency. Students can also earn the Oregon Seal of Bi-literacy, recognizing proficiency in two or more languages.


Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID)

PUBLISHING AND WRITING CENTER

With generous financial support from Columbia Sportswear CEO Tim Boyle, the Roosevelt High School Writing and Publishing Center helps students:

- Develop writing, critical thinking and presentation skills
- Learn to write effective college applications and scholarship essays
- Develop academic skills using a college-level writing center
- Produce, publish and sell books featuring students and local authors
- Create a traveling social justice exhibit

ADVANCED SCHOLARS PROGRAM

The Roosevelt Advanced Scholar Program (Rider Scholars) is a rigorous academic and enrichment opportunity that includes comprehensive mentoring for students at Roosevelt. The program seeks to challenge students to reach their full potential while at the same time preparing them for success after high school.

ROOSEVELT HIGHLIGHTS

Last year, Roosevelt students were awarded nearly \$6 million in scholarships for college. These awards included several Roosevelt student specific scholarships, three Gates Millennium Scholars, and one full ride scholarship to Stanford University. Additionally, Roosevelt has several National Board Certified teachers, one Oregon Teacher of the Year, and one Pulitzer Prize nominated journalist on staff.
