A Message from Principal Pam

One of the perks of my job and the thing that brings me joy is to be able to visit classrooms and see our teachers and students at work. This week, I visited classrooms during reading and word work time. Students are diving into books that they have had the opportunity to choose based on their interests. I also have seen teachers encouraging and empowering students with reading strategies that help them to read books and passages that they never thought they could. In one first grade classroom a child celebrated that he "scooped up the challenging words" and could reread a passage smoothly. In another classroom students were playing a word game and I overheard a student say, "That can't be sit because s is not a blend. It has to be chair, ch-ch-chair. Ch is a blend." It is exciting to see students diving into books and feeling confident as readers.

Lately students have been bringing basketballs and other equipment to school. Because of this, there have been issues on the playground as to whom the equipment belongs to and who is allowed to use it. To ensure student safety, we also try to regulate the number of games, such as football and soccer, within the field and playground space we have available. Please ask your child to leave their equipment at home. Currently, our playground bin is full and there are plenty of basketballs, four square balls, and kickballs for students to use. Additionally, thanks to the generous support of our PTA, our PE and Movement teachers will be able to purchase the equipment we need.
