Many of you have heard from or been introduced to the second half of our amazing counseling team, Ms. Allie Penix. She is excited to be at Llewellyn and wanted to share the following with you:

Hello Llewellyn students and families!

My name is Ms. Allie and some of you might recognize my name from when I introduced myself at the end of August in the Counselor's "Welcome Back" letter. I am the newest member of the counseling team, and will work as the primary school counselor while our awesome Ms. Brittany is on maternity leave.

To say that right now is an unprecedented time feels like an understatement. Right now it is important to give ourselves permission to feel overwhelmed, and to be kind to ourselves about what a challenging time this is. You are not alone! I would love to hear how you are all doing, so please feel free to fill out this <u>Llewellyn Student and Family Check-In Survey</u> to let us know of any support or connection to resources that your family may need (you can also check the <u>Llewellyn COVID-19 Counselor Community Resource list</u> that I created). I am happy to check in and get to know students individually - just send me an email if you are interested (office hours are coming soon as well)!

My social-emotional focus over the coming weeks will center around **resiliency strategies**. I will be providing teachers with weekly asynchronous lessons, and my first slide deck (with a video on the 3rd slide) on mindfulness and breathing can be found here, and my most recent video lesson on measuring the size of a problem and then focusing on what we can (vs. can't control) can be found here.

The resiliency strategy I will be focusing on this week is the importance of having a positive outlook, as studies have shown that <u>resilient individuals use positive emotions to bounce back from negative emotional experiences.</u> I understand that sometimes it is harder to see the bright side when we are faced with what feels like immeasurable challenges... I encourage you all to look for silver linings this week, as gratitude is another resiliency strategy and just the act of <u>giving thanks can make you happier</u>.
