Dear Families,



"Do not think for one minute that because you are who you are, you cannot be who you imagine yourself to be." These words of inspiration shared by Jedidah Isler remind us that we have the power to make our dreams come true- a powerful message to remind our students, especially right now. Jedidah is certainly blazing her trail as an astrophysicist and an active advocate for diversity in STEM! As an award winning Assistant Professor at Dartmouth College, Jedidah continues her scientific research examining the physics of the jet streams emanating from blazars inside super massive black holes in the galaxy. Her love of looking at the stars came from receiving a telescope from her sister for her birthday when she was in middle school. She has earned her PhD and is the founder of VanguardSTEM which is a web series that features interviews hosted by Jedidah and featuring women of color in STEM, discussing academic and professional work and culture as well as current events.

Studying Black History this week, our students have been introduced to many amazing Black scientists, such as Jedidah, artists, stunt pilots, poets and more! Black excellence is being recognized in the third grade by focusing on a different Black American every day, reading and discussing their lives and the challenges they faced breaking barriers and moving towards their dreams. They are also using resources from Epic Books to read about Black Americans of their own choosing and then writing about what they have learned. In grades 3-5 students have been watching videos about Black History and discussing why it is important to celebrate Black History. In many grades the books Let's Talk About Race, The ABCs of Black History, and The Color of Us have been shared and discussed. I am humbled by the amount of research and energy our teachers are putting into making sure to introduce our students to a wide variety of current as well as past famous Black Americans in order to create a rich foundation for conversations about race.

I hope you are enjoying conversations with your children about what they are learning.
