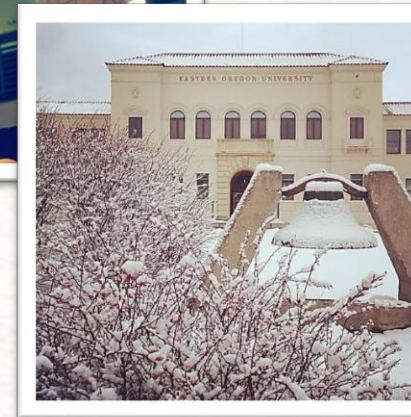
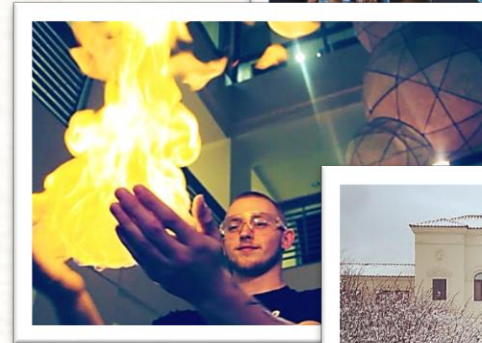




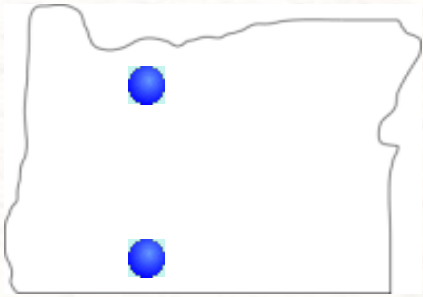
Eastern Oregon University

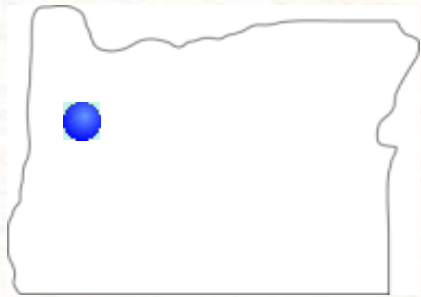
Oregon Institute of Technology

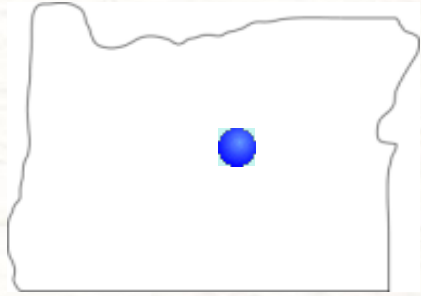

 - Priority Deadline: February 1



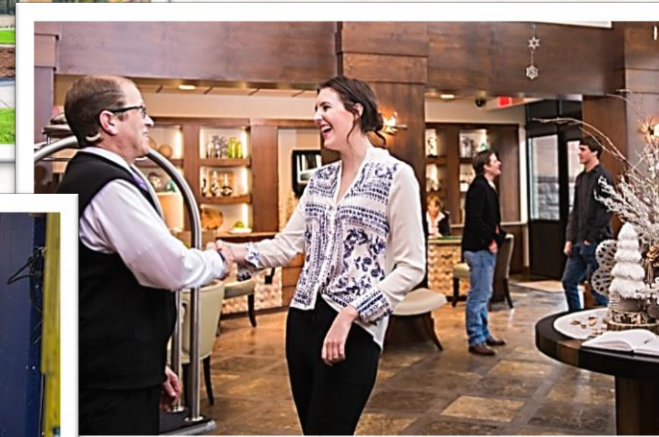

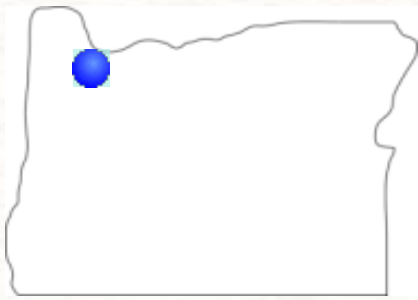
Oregon State University, Cascades

 - Scholarship: February 1



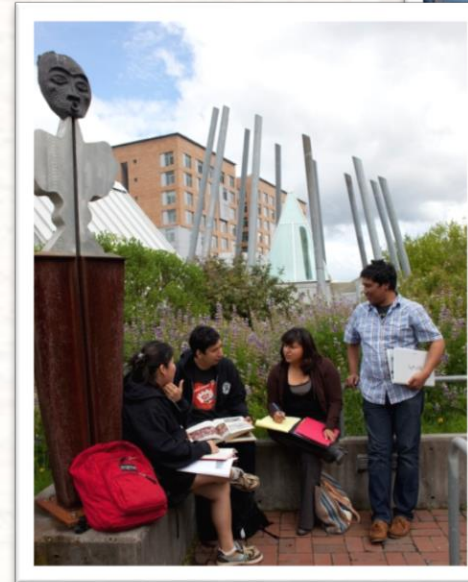

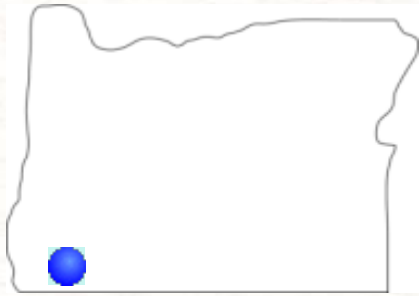

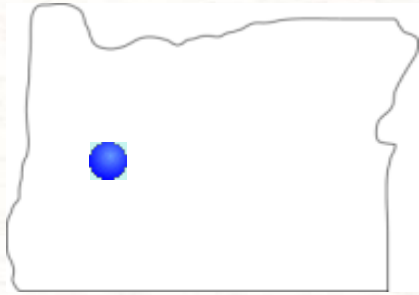


Southern Oregon University

Regular: Rolling Admissions

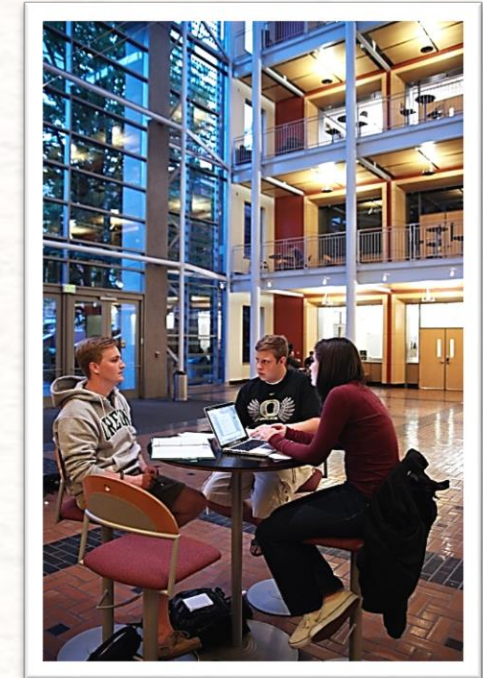
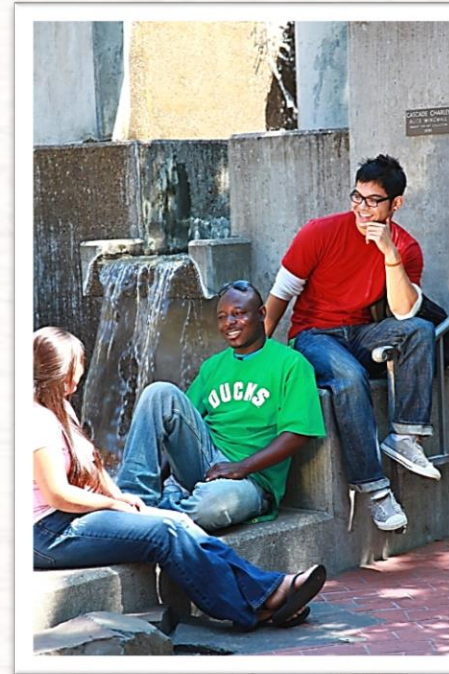




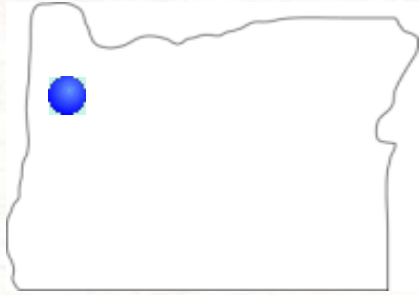

Freshman Admission: Basic Requirements

Here are the basic requirements for all of Oregon's public universities:*

1. Graduate from a public or accredited private high school
2. Meet a satisfactory minimum average GPA
3. Complete the SAT or ACT
4. Complete a minimum of 15 Subject Requirements

Be sure that you visit campus websites or ask an admissions counselor about campus-specific requirements.



**If you don't meet these requirements, you can still apply; ask a counselor for details.*

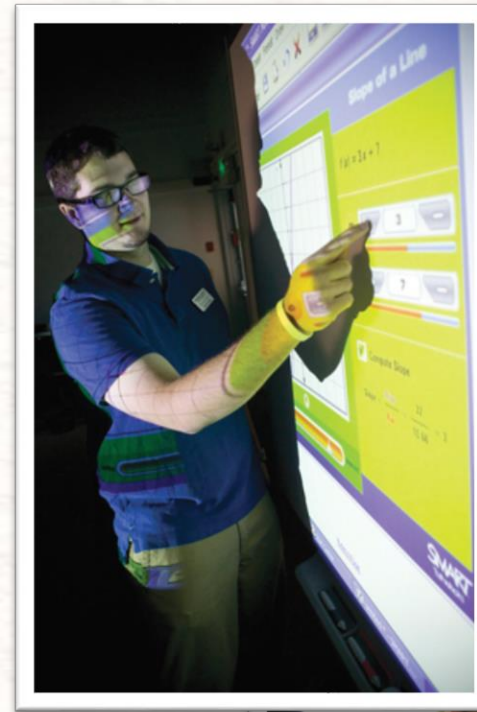
Subject Requirements

Complete the minimum 15 subject requirements:

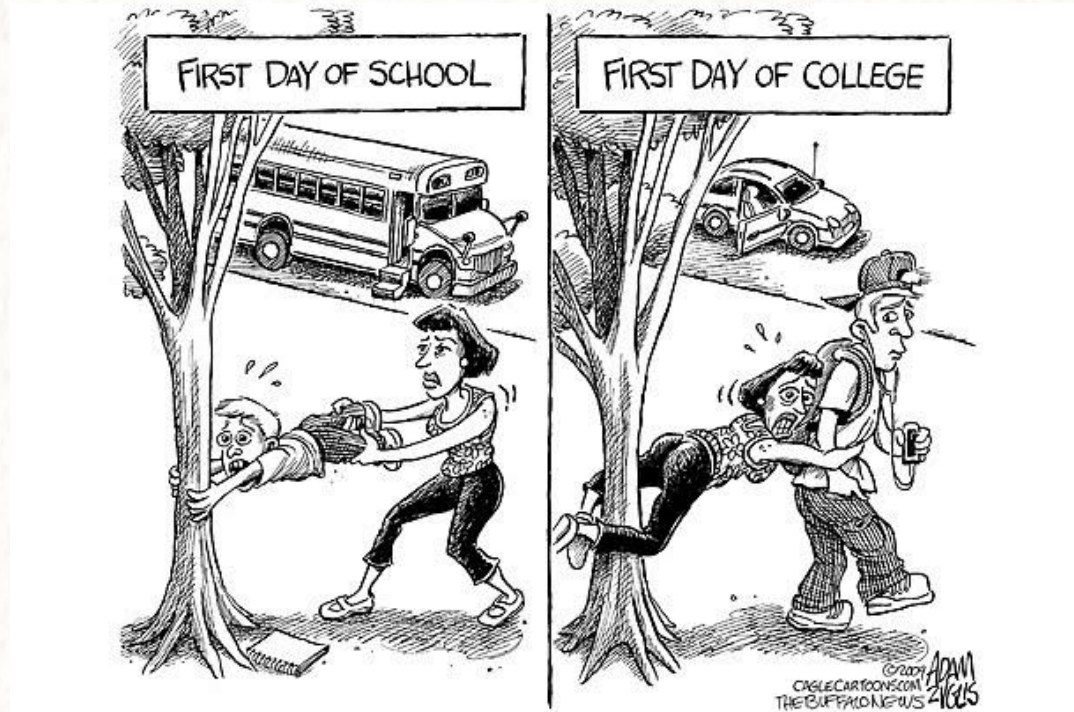
- ✓ 4 Units English
- ✓ 3 Units Math (through Algebra II)
- ✓ 3 Units Social Studies
- ✓ 3 Units Science
- ✓ 2 Units of the Same Second Language

These subjects need to be passed with a C- or better.

Look for the **WUE!** (woo-wee!)

WUE- Western Undergraduate Exchange

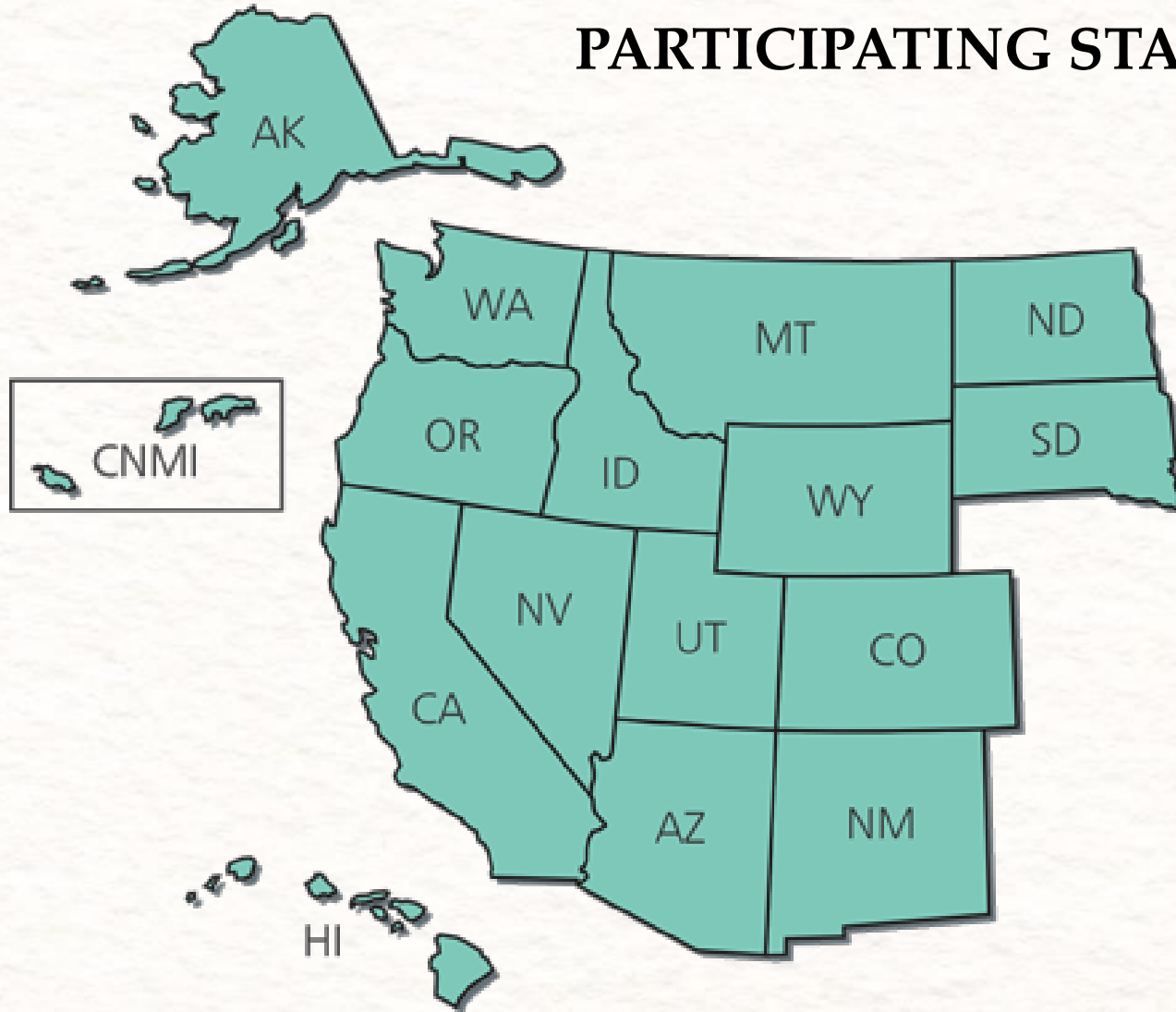

WHAT IS WUE?

- **WUE is a discounted out-of-state tuition rate**
 - 1.5 times (or 150%) the resident tuition rate
- WICHE (Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education) oversees the WUE program
 - Developed to increase access to out-of-state schools
- WUE is good for all four years of college!

Residency	Costs
Resident	\$8,965
Non-Resident	\$25,159
WUE tuition: \$8,965 * 1.5=	\$13,447

Find the right WUE school for you.

- Check out the list of participating colleges and universities- wiche.edu/wue
- Contact the school you're interested in- ask how WUE works for them.
 - 1) What are your eligibility requirements for WUE?
 - 2) What is the application process to apply for WUE?
 - 3) Is WUE only open to certain majors? What if I change my major?
 - 4) Will you extend my WUE if it takes me five years to graduate?
 - 5) (Transfer students) Is WUE available for transfer students?
