

NO OFF CAMPUS LUNCH FRIDAYS

Beginning next week (the week of October 3rd) we will be starting "No Off Campus Lunch Fridays" for students who struggle to make it back to class on time after lunch. Every Thursday after school, we will run a tardy report for the after lunch periods (3rd and 7th) for the Monday-Thursday of that specific week. For students who have 2 or more tardies in their after lunch periods (3rd or 7th) in that week, they will lose off campus lunch privileges on that Friday. Families and students will receive an email on Thursday night informing them that their child must remain on campus the next day. Students must report to the flex space behind the maker space and eat lunch there. Students can purchase lunch from the flex space if they do not normally bring lunch from home. This will reset every Monday and students will be able to go off campus again. However, any student who receives 3 "No Off Campus Lunch Fridays" during the semester will receive a "No Off Campus Lunch Week." We love and support that students are able to go off campus for lunch, but this privilege cannot come at the expense of being in class on time.



This win advances them to the 2nd round of playoffs, which is the first time in at least 45 years (if ever) that Grant has won in the 1st round and advances to the 2nd round. 1. Paid Summer Internship at OHSU: Ted R. Lilley Cure Program:

Say whaaaat - time to apply for an internship for next summer already? Yes!

OHSU has is recruiting now for the Ted R. Lilley Continuing Umbrella of Research Education (CURE) Program - a research internship program supported by the Knight Cancer Institute and the Center for Diversity and Inclusion. It offers hands-on research experiences to Portland-area high school students who excel academically and come from socially or economically disadvantaged backgrounds. LOST AND FOUND ITEMS

The Campus Safety Team has 2 rather large items that are waiting to be claimed. If you have lost an item and can give an accurate description it can be returned. If you are locking your bikes on campus we strongly encourage you to use a U Lock instead of a cable lock. If you see something that causes you concern, say something!

We have a lost and found area on the lower level next to room 33. If students have lost clothing items or water bottles, they should check this area. If students have lost smaller items of value, such as; keys, jewelry, phones, chargers, etc. they need to check at the main office.

NUTRITION SERVICES

The Nutrition Services team has been so excited to see so many students enjoying school meals this year. To help communicate meal account balances to families, the Nutrition Services department will start sending notifications and friendly reminders to families whose student's meal account no longer has funds on it to purchase school meals. Remember, families may apply for free or reduced price meals at any time throughout the school year and must apply every year to maintain eligibility. All families can check their account balances online with SchoolCafe at any time (and there is no charge to view your accounts).

Families have the following options to pay for school meals:

- 1. Pay as you go: Bring cash or check (payable to Portland Public Schools) directly to the cafeteria*
- 2. Prepay for meals with cash or check (payable to Portland Public Schools) in the cafeteria*. Funds will be deposited into the student meal account. Purchases will be deducted from the account balance.
- 3. Pay with a debit/credit card using SchoolCafe, a secure online meal payment system. NOTE: There is a minimum payment of \$15 and a 5% fee per online transaction.
- *Payments can be dropped off at the school office. Please put the payment in an envelope labeled 'cafeteria'. Checks can also be mailed to PPS Nutrition Services, 501 N Dixon St, Portland, OR 97227.

SAFEOREGON TIP LINE

SafeOregon was funded by the Oregon Legislature as part of a statewide effort to improve school safety. It provides a secure means for anyone to anonymously report suspicious or imminently unsafe situations, such as threats of violence, fights, drugs and alcohol, weapons, bullying, harassment, intimidation or self-harm. Anyone, from students to parents to community members, can access the system in a variety of ways, including:

To receive text notifications, you must opt in to the service. **You opt in by texting YES to 68453.** Parents and students should confirm their cell numbers listed in the student information system.
