What is SUN School?

Sabin SUN, a program of Self Enhancement, Inc. (SEI) aims to improve the lives of children, their families and the community by extending the school day and developing Schools as "neighborhood hubs" by brining in resources from the community.

Is SUN daycare?

NO. While SUN does offer free extended day programming, it should not be looked at as free daycare. SUN does not run consistently throughout the school year. It only runs Monday to Thursday in 8-week increments. Enrollment is also not guaranteed as we often have more students sign-up then we have slots for and carry a wait-list.

Is there a cost to SUN?

No! All classes are free.

How does registration work?

Classes will be filled on a Lottery basis, with priority given to students with academic Risk factors (Save a SUN Spot students). This means that placement will be random, but ultimately left up to the discretion of SUN staff. Request forms can be turned into the SUN box in the main office.

NOTE-ALL families must fill out a digital SEI/SUN registration form once they've received a confirmation email that their student got into SUN.

What is Save a SUN Spot?

We ask teachers to help us identify students who would benefit the most from SUN. Many of these students need extra academic support. This system ensures all students receive an equitable opportunity to participate in SUN.

Is registration open to all grades?

No. Registration is only open to **Grades 1-5 Only**.

Important SUN Notes:

- A 15-minute recess period is built into the SUN school schedule. Pick-up this term will be in the gym. You must sign your student out with the Site Manager before leaving.
- If you student is in Grade 3-5, they may self release—ONLY if parent permission has been given to Site Manager. Permission must be in written form. Rachel can be reached at rachelc@selfenhancement.org.

Notes about late pick-up-PLEASE READ!!

We understand that emergencies arise. We also understand that traffic can be challenging or hectic, but we do expect all children to be picked up on time. When your child is picked up late, our staff is required to remain working and therefore, unable to attend to commitments of their own.

The third late pick-up (10 minutes or more) will result in three weeks off from SUN school. Please be considerate of our staff in following the program times, with the exception of an extreme emergency. Late pick-up notifications will be emailed to you the following day.

YOU MUST SIGN THAT YOU UNDERSTAND AND AGREE TO THIS POLICY FOR YOUR CHILD TO ATTEND SUN.

SUN BEHAVIORAL EXPECATIONS

The safety and well-being of all participants and staff is of utmost importance. To ensure safety in SUN Community Schools, we require that all participants be able to follow all three of the following criteria.

- 1. Be age appropriate for the activity/program
- 2. Be able to maintain safe behavior during the activity. This means that they can participate without harming themselves or others. Specific behaviors include:
 - $\boldsymbol{-}$ Treating adults and other students with respect,
 - Following directions of adult instructors and coordinators,
 - Remaining in the assigned room until dismissal,
 - Engaging in safe, non-violent behavior.
- 3. Participate meaningfully in the activity and not disrupt or distract others.

If issues arise, the following process is to be followed:

- Remind student of class expectations.
- 2. Give verbal warning that continuation of behavior will lead to removal from the activity.
- 3. Remove student from the activity for some time out with the SUN Site Manager.
- 4. SUN Site Manager will discuss behaviors with the student to determine if they are able to return to the activity. If a student is sent to the Site Manager a second time, the student will receive a written warning and be sent home for the day.

Written Warning Consequence Progression

- 1. First Written Warning: SUN manager phones parents/guardians to notify them that their student must leave SUN programming for the day but may return the next day.
- 2. Second Written Warning; SUN manager phones parents/guardians, student is sent home and may not return for the week
