MYP Programme:

Middle Years Youth Programme

Anna Wessinger (WSMS 8th Grade LA/SS & IB Middle Years Programme Coordinator)

How to build the strongest students we can, in preparation for a rigorous education at Lincoln High School. The MYP Programme (ideally) will support this process.

Making sure that what we are teaching has real purpose. We will start to see Unit Planners.

MYP will include eight subjects

- Language acquisition.
- <u>Language and literature</u>.
- Individuals and societies.
- Sciences.
- Mathematics.
- Arts.
- · Physical and health education.
- Design.

Different Teachers will consider this theme: Time, Place and Space.

This is not a dramatic shift in the education our children will receive in Middle School. It's a new way of talking about it, though, with the importance of making connections between the different disciplines.

Anna reports a notable change in the perspective of the children. A sense of self drive (with real world application).

Policy Conversation:

Academic Honesty Policy

A requirement of the MYP plan is the creation of an academic honesty policy. Anna shared a portion of the draft, for consideration and conversation.

Use of cell phones emerged as an important issue. "Off and Away - All Day."

Ben discussed the challenge that adults don't follow this policy. So, some softening this year. All agree that this is a difficult situation.

Some wonderings about the sophistication of the language, and whether it might be lost.

Parent feedback is welcomed.
